
ROWDE BOOK CLUB

BOOK REVIEWS To The Lighthouse by Virginia Woolf



Your Parish Council

The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meeting in March 2016 were:

Village Infrastructure New noticeboard in Tanis

A new noticeboard has been installed in Tanis. Thank you to the Parish Council Chair, S Mundy, for installing the new board.

New fencing around toddlers' play area (Tower View)

Three quotes were considered for new fencing around the toddlers' play area next to St. Matthew's Church. It has been agreed to replace the existing timber post frame with metal hooped top fencing. The existing timber posts have rotted and the fence is unstable. A new gate will also be installed.

Defibrillator training

Thank you to those people who attend the defibrillator awareness session on Tuesday 23rd February 2016. Sixteen people in total attended the session. Please see lifesaving information on the Community Heartbeat Trust leaflet, featured on page

Fibre-optic Broadband

There are no further updates on fibre-optic broadband coming to the village. It is assumed that BT are still on schedule to supply fibre-optic broadband to Rowde by the summer (2016), as has been previously stated.

Drainage on the Large Playing field – purchase of new trees

It has been proposed that ten semi-mature trees are purchased and planted alongside the bridle path off Sands Lane to help improve the long term drainage on the large playing field. The Parish Council agreed to investigate the proposal further. In addition, it was suggested that three quotes should be obtained for digging out the ditch in that area.

Safety

Community Speed watch

The Community Speed watch Team & the Police have been active monitoring speeding vehicles through the village during the month of March.

T Jeffries, Team Leader of Rowde Speed watch, has confirmed that the Police are currently acting on the data supplied by the Community Speed watch teams within 13 days. Guidelines recommend action is taken within 14 days.

The Parish has been allocated its own Speed Indicator Device (S.I.D) for permanent use in the village. The Clerk is investigating the cost involved in putting up and taking down the S.I.D device after the time specified for use.

Part-time night lighting in the Village

There is still time to comment on Wiltshire Council's suggestion to switch off some lights overnight in the village. Maps showing the lights proposed to be switched off can be viewed on the village website at: rowdevillage. org, through the Parish Council Facebook page, or on the village noticeboards. The Parish Council thanks A. Watters, Village News Editor, for including the maps in the February edition of the Rowde Village News.

Highways update

- The ditches along Devizes Road, near to Conscience Lane, have been dug out by Wiltshire Council. It was suggested that English Landscapes are asked to seed the mounds of earth left behind in order to firm up the bank.
- Wiltshire Council are seeking an engineering solution to the problems caused by the narrow pavement along Devizes Road towards Dunkirk Hill.
- A suggestion has been made to gravel the footpath area outside of Furlong Close to ease use by pedestrians walking to and from the canal. The Clerk is investigating the ownership of the land and possible collaborative improvements to the path.

Community Resilience Planning

Two Parish Councillors recently attended a Community Resilience Planning workshop. Wiltshire Council is encouraging parishes to amalgamate their existing local Emergency, Snow and Flood plans in one comprehensive plan. A small group of Parish Councillors has been tasked with drafting a response to the document which will be shared at the Parish Council meeting in April

Cleaning up the Village Dog fouling

Concern has been raised about dog waste that is being left on pavements, mainly in Marsh Lane and Springfield Road. Dog owners are reminded of their legal obligations to pick up after their dogs. It was agreed by the Parish Council to produce an awareness poster and to deliver leaflets to the affected areas in an effort to reduce the unpleasant effects of dog mess in the village.

New Equipment

It has been proposed to replace the street orderly cart used for litter collecting in the village.

Clean for the Queen & Village Clean Up day

In response to requests for help to clean up the village and to 'Clean for the Queen', one person volunteered (thank you to Rosie). St. Matthew's Church and Rowde Primary Academy School were also willing to be involved in projects.

It has been suggested that 'cleaning up the village' becomes task based instead of being based around one day's activities. A volunteer has already kindly offered to paint the Church gates and the kissing gate. The Parish Council hopes to devise a list of task specific projects which will run over the summer months.

Due to the lack of support from the village, the Parish Council decided not to enter the Best Kept Village Competition. However, the Parish Council hopes to encourage residents to clean up their own gardens and the area immediately in front of their house.

Planning

16/01910/FUL - 31 Tower View Rowde Devizes:

New vehicular access. The majority of Councillors had no objections to the application. The Parish Council agreed to the application subject to the Highways Department at Wiltshire Council dealing with issues surrounding land ownership of the grass verge, the existing footpath and any issues that arise from losing the existing parking bay there.

16/01671/FUL Greenfields, Bath Road: Conversion of Greenfields into 2 flats, erection of a new 3 bedroom dwelling attached to Greenfields and associated works. This was sent by Wiltshire Council as a courtesy planning application. The Parish Council thanked Wiltshire Council for their consideration and agreed with the application in principle.

16/01941/FUL 12 Devizes Road: new vehicular access. The Parish Council had no objections.

Proposed bungalow development – Silverlands Road

The proposed start date of the construction of the new bungalows behind Silverlands Road is 27th June 2016, although this will be confirmed once the contractors have been appointed. The interests of safety are secured by condition no. 9 of the Construction Method Statement (CMS) which must be submitted and approved by Wiltshire Council prior to any commencement on site. This details:

- a) Parking of the vehicles of site operatives and visitors.
- b) The access route to the site of the vehicles and of the site operatives and visitors.

- c) Loading and unloading of plant and materials.
- d) Storing of plant and materials used in constructing the development.
- e) Measures to control the emission of dust and dirt during construction.
- f) Measures for the protection of the natural environment.
- g) Hours of construction, including deliveries.

The approved CMS shall be complied with throughout the construction period, the Parish Council will receive a copy of the document when it has been drafted/submitted.

Bus Service Consultation

People are invited to have their say on a review of subsidised bus services in Wiltshire. The review is being carried out as part of wider plans to help Wiltshire Council save money.

The consultation can be found at www.wiltshire.gov. uk/subsidised-bus-servicesconsultation. Paper copies can be picked up in council offices, libraries, on buses operating contracted services, or people can call 0300 456 0100 to have one posted to them. The consultation runs until 4 April 2016.

Parish Council Facebook Page

The Parish Council Facebook page is increasing in its number of hits. The most popular item in March was the installation of the new noticeboard in Tanis. Other items raised included concern about dog fouling and continuing safety concerns on Conscience Lane. The page can be accessed through the Rowde Parish Council Facebook Page.

JAN'S RECIPES

Our recipes are following a more summery feel this month.

Spaghetti pasta Salad

INGREDIENTS:

- 12 ounces thin spaghetti
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1/2 cup diced pepperoni
- 1/2 cup diced fully cooked ham
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/2 cup diced tomato
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped cucumber
- 1/4 cup sliced ripe olives
- 1 avocado, peeled and diced, optional
- 1 bottle (8 ounces) Italian salad dressing

METHOD:

1. In a large saucepan, cook spaghetti according to package directions. Meanwhile in a large salad bowl, add the cheese, pepperoni, ham, green

pepper, tomato, onion, cucumber and olives. Add avocado if desired.

2. Rinse pasta with cold water; drain well. Place on top of salad ingredients. Drizzle with salad dressing: toss



lightly to coat. Chill until serving. Yield: 15-20 servings.

Special Rhubarb Cake

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 2 cups chopped fresh or frozen rhubarb
- STREUSEL TOPPING:
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- VANILLA SAUCE:
- 1/2 cup butter, cubed
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

METHOD:

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg. Combine flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture



alternately with buttermilk, beating just until moistened. Fold in the rhubarb. Pour into a greased 9-in. square baking dish.

- 2. Combine topping ingredients; sprinkle over batter. Bake 40-45 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack.
- 3. For sauce, melt butter in a saucepan. Add sugar and milk. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2-3 minutes or until thickened. Remove from heat; stir in vanilla. Serve with cake. Yield: 9 servings (1-1/4 cups sauce).

Editor's Note: If using frozen rhubarb, measure rhubarb while still frozen, then thaw completely. Drain in a colander, but do not press liquid out.

(all or most ingredients are available from the village shop so remember to get them there, Ed)

EATING OUT - THE JOLLY HUNTSMAN

The Jolly Huntsman is a privately owned, traditional village freehouse, situated in the peaceful and picturesque village of Kington St Michael, just 2 miles from Junction 17 of the M4 and close to other popular local villages such as Castle Combe, Badminton and Lacock.

The building dates back to the 18th Century and the premises were originally used as The White Horse Brewery in the 19th Century before becoming an inn. One of the old wells, used in the brewing process is still in existence today. The property was re-named as The Jolly Huntsman in the early 1970s.

The restaurant is open and serves food every lunchtime and evening.

Opening hours are:

Monday - Thursday: 11.30am-2.30pm and 6.00pm - 11.00pm.

Friday and Saturday: 11.30am - 2.30pm and 6.00pm - 12 midnight.

Sunday: 12 Noon - 3.00pm and 7.00pm - 10.30pm.

Lunch is available from 11.30am - 2.00pm from Monday to Saturday and 12 Noon - 2.00pm on Sundays.

Dinner is served from 6.30pm - 9.30pm from Monday to Saturday and 7.00pm - 9.00pm on a Sunday.



Thoughts from The Rectory

I love spring; after the damp and chill of winter it is wonderful to see shoots appear in the hedgerows and in the trees and bushes in our gardens and to see the lambs begin to appear in our fields. All around are signs of new life – and many of us find that our mood lifts as we begin to feel the warmth of the sun on our backs.

We have just celebrated Easter. The key themes of this season are also new life and new hope. On that first Easter the darkness of Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday was replaced by joy as the word spread that Jesus has risen! The disciples didn't understand the significance of what had happened at first; but through the power of the Spirit of God they came to understand that through Jesus God's love for all had been revealed in a new way.

We will find it hard to say goodbye — but I'll come to that next month.

None of us, of course, can know exactly what the future holds. But there is certainty within this uncertainty. God longs to Bless us wherever we go and whatever our circumstances. I pray that we may all be more and more aware of this in the days ahead.



The last of the 2015 harvest wheat should be moving from the farm in the first half of April. This consignment is going to ADM at Avonmouth, where it is ground into flour. ADM supplies the baking industry with more than 400 staple baking ingredients to meet a wide range of customer applications. The prices we are paid this year are around 30% below that which we obtained last year – I haven't noticed much of a drop in the price of bread in the supermarkets! EU wheat markets have been pressured by rising production and slow export demand, as a result of very aggressive pricing from the Black sea and Baltic regions, again mainly due to increased production and increased stocks from the previous season.

We have managed to apply the first dose of fertiliser on all the crops to try and wake them up from the winter. The recent cold weather has not helped plant health, and there are some very scorched-looking fields caused by the chilly winds. The oilseed rape has been under constant attack from hungry pigeons since the end of February. Some fields are looking quite bare and it remains to be seen if they will recover. Interestingly they have left the ones on to of Roundway Hill alone - presumably it is too cold even for pigeons to feed up there!

Our training course have continued and a number of candidates have passed their telehandler certificates (JCB Loader), as have some sprayer operators who have achieved competences. In addition we have had some candidates for a certificate in animal transport over short journeys up to 65 kilometres – another new legal requirement. The latest qualification we are now geared up to offer is for vertebrate control (rats and mice) by rodenticides. Most farmers and growers will require this by 2017.

Planning is underway for Open Farm Sunday which this year is on 5th June. We have a few new ideas to add to the success of last year's event so hopefully the weather will be more summery by then. Today (Easter Sunday) is certainly not very spring-like! Our Archaeology event has been very well supported by the people of Rowde and Bromham and we are looking forward to meeting around 60 of you on 30th March.







SHORT STORY

'Where Something Might Happen' by Carl Eugene Moore

Stephen Dunn called his court to order. The Pulitzer Prize Winning poet sat at a blue cloth draped folding table in front of a small auditorium, a poetry craft seminar that was beginning five minutes late.

"I have an essay here to read. It's about twenty minutes or so. We can do that. But I was thinking that we might start with you. If you'd like to ask some questions, I'll answer them and then we can move on to some poems I brought to read. Then we can get your reactions and discuss them." He stopped and looked around for an up stretched hand.

Most rooms are filled with people who want to ask questions, but here there was palpable reticence filling the air. No one wanted to be the first to risk embarrassment.

No one but me.

"How do you write a poem?" I asked, innocence wrapped around the sentence, which I blurted out clear and concise so it would carry to the front of the room. I saw the words make their way slowly from my mouth, over the heads of those in front of me; they were in rainbow colours, like a clown's wig, a last minute costume from the dollar store on its way to Stephen's Pulitzer Prize-Winning ears. I tried to recover from my idiocy.

"I mean, how do you write a poem? What is your process? What happens when you get up in the morning and say, "I want to write a poem today?" I hoped words like "process" might overtake the clown words.

They didn't.

Stephen smiled in knowing benevolence. I held my breath. Everyone held their breath. I prepared to receive my sentence for having the unmitigated gall to ask this poet such a naive, amateur question as "how do you write a poem?"

"Well," he began still smiling, "I certainly don't get a poem every day. Sometimes I go days without something new. Every day I do try. I sit and make myself ready to receive a poem."

He paused to let this sink in. The collective began to breathe once more. I realized I was to be spared for my naivete.

"The most important thing," he said, teeth showing through the wide smile under his full graying beard, "is to put yourself in a place where something might happen."

The words shot into me and rattled around like a bullet. "Put yourself where something might happen," he said again. "Too often we approach a poem or some other writing with some notion of what

we want to happen. Those are usually the flat poems, the didactic poems, preachy things with no life. We already know what happened and we're simply trying to press the moments into verse. Contrivances. Doesn't work. You can't pull that one over on a reader. They see it before they get to the last line. No, you have to find a place where something might happen, where something unexpected might sneak up on you and smack you in the back of the head. It's that surprise, that inspiration that makes a poem good or even great."

He leaned back into the red, plastic chair, allowing us time to scramble for the jewels he had tossed in our direction.

"Where," he continued after a moment," is elusive and personal. Where may be a physical location, perhaps the steps of the Parthenon in Greece. Perhaps it is a garden in your back yard. Maybe it's on a subway train. Maybe it's simply a quiet place you use or visit regularly. The point is that you must find a place and use it, visit it regularly. Let what shows up surprise you."

Four words "where something might happen " had grabbed me by the neck and shaken me. How often had I approached writing poetry as an act of informative reflection, a recounting of some personal tale meaning nothing to anyone save me? I remembered Stephen's keynote address the day before. To paraphrase, "Writers are narcissists endeavouring to involve the reader in what involves them. The truth of it is that only the meaning of what involves the writer is important to the reader."

Too often I have tried to merely report facts and events in a journalistic fashion, hoping the reader will indulge in my self-interest. Seldom have I been able, or willing to pursue the meanings of events, or to convey such to the reader, to connect with him across the page.

Stephen went on to answer other questions about the mechanics of craft, but his most important words remained with me.

Then, I had occasion to chat privately with Stephen before he left for the airport. He was sitting alone at a glass table in the deserted, sunlit student commons area. I walked over and asked if he minded some company. He said, "Please," indicating the chrome chair opposite him. I dropped my backpack and sat.

"You ask great questions," he said, smiling from behind mirrored sunglasses.

I don't remember the rest of the conversation.



Now Spring is here and (at time of writing this) Easter is approaching things are picking up at the cafe. Mothering Sunday was our busiest yet and we are looking forward to Easter next weekend and the School holidays. Wiltshire Sight offers Online Today Project



Supporting people living with sight loss

Wiltshire Sight is to help blind and partially sighted people – and or people with hearing loss – across Wiltshire get online and enjoy the benefits of the internet.

The Wiltshire charity is helping to deliver the nationwide Online Today project which is being led by The Royal National Institute of Blind People (RNIB) and funded by a £5.8m Big Lottery Fund grant.

Online Today aims to help those with sensory loss get online. This could be someone living with hearing loss, sight loss or both. The programme enables people to get the most out of being online. Wiltshire Sight will help people with sensory loss learn everything from sending emails to keeping in touch with family and friends to browsing websites to keep up to date with news and leisure interests. Introductions to social media are also available with Online Today, assistance with Twitter and Facebook can be provided as well as setting up a skype account.

Online today is led by RNIB and 37 other groups. These include Guide Dogs and Sense and Action on Hearing Loss. The scheme will help more than 200 adults with hearing or sight loss feel the benefits of technology across Wiltshire. In total, Online Today is being delivered to 125,000 with sensory loss across the UK.

Neil Heslop, Managing Director of RNIB Solutions, said:

"Technology has changed the way we live our lives, from how we communicate and socialise to the way we look for jobs and pay our bills. For people who have sight or hearing loss, being able to get online can make a huge difference to being able to live independently but it can be quite daunting if you don't know where to start.

"Online Today will deliver the skills, training and confidence that will make a huge difference to so many people's lives and will make sure they're not being excluded from today's digital world."

Wiltshire Sight aims to use this programme to arrange introduction taster sessions throughout the year to inform over 200 people across the county, incuding Swindon, about the advantages of getting online. The information will be available at all of the charity's monthly drop-ins, technology sessions and at their main office – St Lucy's Sight Centre in Devizes.


