


BOOK REVIEWS

The Lower River by Paul Thereaux

A story about an American small town businessman who makes a return trip to the remote African village he fell in love with during his youth when he was there as a volunteer worker. In his mind he carried the memories of his time there, seeing it as an almost Utopian dream. He is disillusioned with the way his own life has 'panned out' and can't wait to visit the village and its people and the school that he had helped to build to educate the children.

He therefore sells up and divorces his wife to make the pilgrimage back to Africa. But the dream is shattered as he gradually realises that the country and its people are far removed from the pictures he held in his mind.

It was a fairly good read – illustrating the damage to a way of life even when the intention was good.







Your Parish Council

The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meeting in March were:

Neighbourhood Plans

o The Clerk and a Parish Councillor attended an open consultation in Potterne to view the progress of their Neighbourhood Plan. There was a good response from villagers there. A further article on the benefits and disadvantages of Neighbourhood Plans will follow in a later issue of the magazine.

Planning Applications

- o Pole Krazee fitness club at the New Bakery, High Street has applied to extend its opening hours (15/02309/VAR). This is a variation on the original application which requested to change the use of the building from industrial to leisure use (14/08871/FUL). The new application to extend the opening hours will be considered in full at the Parish Council meeting on Wednesday 15th April, 8.00pm.
- o 15/01681/FUL: Durlett Farm House, Durlett, Bromham: erection of an oak framed building. The Parish Council had no objections.

Communications Plan

o The Parish Council discussed the need for a communication plan and agreed to discuss the item further, along with social networking, at the Parish Council meeting in April.

New Community Police Officer

o PC Andy List was introduced to the Parish Council. Recent vandalism and petty thefts at the allotments were reported to PC List. Concern was also raised with PC List about parking on grass verges and pavements around the village. Police can deal with the matter if a car is causing an obstruction, otherwise it is a matter for the Highways Department at Wiltshire Council.

Speedwatch

o The Community Speedwatch team continue to monitor speeding vehicles through the village. A further two locations have been added to their programme.

Village Safety

o A concern was raised about the condition of the roads into and around Rowde, especially from cyclists' view point. Residents are urged to report concerns through the My Wiltshire App, or by phoning Wiltshire Council on 0300 456 0105.

Defibrillator

o It has been suggested that the defibrillator is sited at the bus stop opposite the Cross Keys pub, next to Rowde Hall, on the High Street. The Clerk will look into the feasibility of siting the defibrillator at this site.

Large Playing Field - football

- o A response has been received from the football league regarding our complaint about the recent mistreatment of the facilities.
- o It was clarified by the Parish Council that the pavilion remains the responsibility of the hirer. An inspection should be carried out upon departure and a charge will be made if any excessive cleaning is required.
- o It was agreed that C Stevens will purchase a new padlock for the pavilion and will be the principal key holder. The Clerk will notify the current users.

Sports Field development

- o A quote for supplying power to the large playing field has been received. The cost for supplying electricity over ground is approximately £30k, and underground is £60K.
- o A small working group has agreed to meet in April to discuss future plans for pavilion development.

MAGGIE'S RECIPE Mincemeat Cake

It's my mum Maggie's recipe and she will be 92 in April. I have taken it from her hand written book of favourite recipes. The measurements are all imperial I'm afraid ...sorry!

INGREDIENTS:

- 10 oz Self Raising flour
- 3 Large eggs
- 5 oz Caster sugar
- 12 oz Jar of mincemeat
- 5 oz Soft butter
- 3 oz Sultanas
- 1 oz flaked Almonds for the top

METHOD:

- 1. Grease and line an 8" cake tin
- 2. Mix all the ingredients together until fully blended
- 3. Place in the cake tin and sprinkle with the flaked almonds.
- 4. Bake at gas mark 3 for 1 hour 45 minutes until a cocktail stick inserted in cake is clear.

EATING OUT - DOLCIPANI

This month we feature Dolcipani, an Italian lunch eatery, and possibly the best one in Devizes according to reviews!

I have very much enjoyed eating there myself, but I haven't visited for a while so I thought it better to let you read a few very recent reviews. Ed

After a walk we looked out this cafe for lunch - having seen the reviews on Tripadvisor. It is in 'Old Swan Yard' just off the High Street. Both my wife and I each had a hot Ciabatta roll (with a side salad) which came with a drink for £6 each - very good value. A coffee or tea alone would cost less than £1.50 which is certainly cheaper by some way over most other high street coffee shops. The service was good and the food came quickly - and was really tasty. As it was lunch time it was quite full and therefore had an artisan atmosphere - love it! I did not

take up the offer but you can have a coffee and biscuit/cake for £3 - cakes are homemade too! A great find and will look it up again when we



At the heart of your community

As to be expected, one of the main obstacles that I come across when working out in the villages is the sheer lack of transport available to those



Many people in our rural communities depend on the services offered by their local LINK scheme, and without these schemes many of the people that I speak to would be well and truly stuck! There are five Link schemes in the Devizes Community Area Devizes & District Link; Four Villages; Easterton, Market Lavington & Urchfont; Village Care & Link and Worton & Marston Link. These schemes are all run by local people, for local people and all of them are always very keen to welcome others.

There are many ways to get involved in your local scheme and much to be gained from doing so. It is a fantastic way to get to know people in your community and a great way of keeping active and getting out of your home!

The majority of people that support their Link service do so by offering to drive others who may have difficulty accessing public transport and do not themselves drive. Some Link schemes offer good-neighbourly services and welcome people with skills that want to volunteer their services locally – gardening or DIY for example. You could also help out by co-ordinating calls and arranging for volunteers to visit people or take them to hospital appointments. There are many opportunities and the beauty of it is that you can get as involved as much or as little as you wish!

TOP HOMEOPATHIC REMEDIES FOR COLDS AND FLU

Aconite - Early stages of colds, fevers, inflammations. Complaints come on suddenly. Possible causes: cold/dry wind; fright / shock. Characterised by extreme restlessness and fear. May specifically have an unfounded fear of death. Dry. hot skin. Symptoms worse in: evening / around midnight. Thirsty for cold drinks. May say everything tastes bitter, except water. Better for: fresh air. Worse for: touch.

Allium Cepa - Common, feverish cold with streaming eyes and nose. Profuse, watery nasal discharge which burns upper lip. Red, running eyes with bland discharge. Headache, worse in warm room. Worse: evening and stuffy rooms. Better: open air and cold room.

Arsenicum album - Catches cold easily: burning, watery nasal discharge alternating with dryness. Frequent sneezing without relief. Very chilly and shivery. Nostrils become sore and red and nose feels blocked alternating with watery discharge. Worse: change of temperature, cold, damp and after midnight. Better: heat and warm applications, hot drinks.

Eupatorium perfoliatum - Chill followed by heat and sweating. Intense aching of bones as if broken or bruised. Great thirst for cold drinks. Worse: movement, cold, open air. Better: Resting, warmth, sweating.

Ferrum Phos - Tired and weary, not feeling quite right. First signs of a cold or flu. Red inflamed eyes. Chill with shivering and fever with flushed face. Hot, burning, gritty eyes. Worse: quick movements, cold air. Better: rest, cold applications.

Gelsemium - No 1 remedy for flu. Dull, sluggish, with heavy looking eyes and dull headache usually at the back of the neck. Chills and shivering up and down the spine. Aching muscles in limbs and back. Burning throat. Colds and flu usually comes on gradually. Worse: cold, damp weather. Better: after urination.

Nux vomica - Colds and flu with extreme chilliness; just cannot get warm. Nose blocked at night but runs during the day, or lots of sneezing alternating with blocked nose, sides can alternate. Sore or raw throat and teeth may ache. Thirsty and Irritable. Worse: early morning, eating, cold air. Better: heat, lying down, sleep.


Pulsatilla - Chilliness even in a warm room, nasal catarrh, bland and thick. Dry mouth with no thirst. Painful headache with changing, shifting symptoms. Worse: in a warm room, after lying down. Better: in the open air.

Rhus toxicodendron - Very restless with aching in all muscles and stiffness. Just cannot get comfortable. Heat alternating with chills; pain in the head and eyes with red face. Worse: night, first movement. Better: warmth.

This winter seems to have dragged on with plenty of gloomy weather but by the time you read this the clocks will have moved forward and hopefully the days will be warmer. More daylight means that things have started to change in the fields. The oilseed rape seems to have survived the winter pigeon attacks and is now growing; the small flower buds are just visible. It is important to start feeding the plants once they begin to extend the stems, so we have been applying nitrogen while the ground is dry. This year we have Lithuanian nitrogen which was considerably cheaper than the UK version. The spreader passed its MOT and we tested all the different fertiliser products that are used to make sure that it applies the correct rate and spreads in a uniform pattern. The machine 'talks' to the tractor electronically via an isobus connection. The tractor has a screen which controls all the functions such as application rate and weight of the fertiliser left in the tank; it allows the operator to adjust the rate on the move just by touching the screen. It is all very different from the Little Vicon spreader we had 30 years ago!

Sixty five years ago my grandfather built a new cow shed which housed the milking herd and accommodated the milking process. The dairy cows left the farm in the early 1960s and since then the building has been used variously as a store for grain (when it was in sacks), a beef cow rearing shed, and a fertiliser store and latterly as stables. Now it is about to have a complete transformation. We are renovating it into an educational room at one end with an indoor area for demonstrating machinery or livestock to the visiting schools, and we will be laying on some further course for farmers. In addition there will also be some other short courses including one for smallholders and another for anyone who is interested in learning about what happens on farms. The first task is to replace the roof which we will be starting this week.

Finally I thought you might like to see a photograph we recently discovered as a negative which is from a different era. Hill Covert appears to be the background, and I think that the young lad on top of the cart may be the late Arthur Sims who worked here for over 50 years. I wonder what he would make of today's modern machinery!




Having just finished a very busy weekend with many deserving Mums being treated to Sunday lunch by their families, we are now looking towards Easter which is fast approaching.

Dog Control Orders

Dog control orders are in place in Wiltshire. In 2012, Wiltshire Council introduced four Dog Control Orders under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act (2005). The Dog Control Orders in place:



- Require a person in charge of a dog to clean up after it has defecated on any area of land within Wiltshire which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled to have access with or without payment
- Make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to allow it to enter a children's play area which is enclosed buy a fence, wall or similar structure.
- Require the person in charge of a dog to put it on a lead of no more than two metres in length when asked to do so by an authorised officer of Wiltshire Council
- Requires dog walkers on Box Recreation Ground to keep their dogs on a lead at all times.
- o Anyone failing to comply with the Dog Control Orders may be issued a fixed penalty fine of £75 and may lead to prosecution and a fine of up to £1000.

ROWDE COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH UPDATE

The Rowde Speed Watch team of volunteers has been out and about, on and off, now since the 1st December 2014 (having had a break since the previous team were active), in all of that time we have never been rained off or snowed off. The speed camera did let us down on one occasion when the frost and the mist was too much for the equipment. Having the camera letting us down in such circumstances was inconvenient because it is in such inclement weather that there is an even greater need for traffic to pass slowly through our village. We have to do a count of all vehicles passing

We have to do a count of all vehicles passing through for the record and there are many times when there are more than 600 vehicles an hour travelling down the High Street and Devizes Road. So what kind of vehicles speed through the village? As you would expect the majority of vehicles are cars and it is car drivers who transgress the most, both in numbers and percentage wise, there are a few white van drivers living up to their reputation, very few lorry drivers speeding and not one motor cyclist. However we did catch a cyclist pedalling through at 17 mph (not certain if the cyclist was pleased to hear about his speed or not).

I am sure many of you read in the national newspapers of the speed watch team in Cambridgeshire who managed to catch 1,600 speeders a month. One man alone is credited with trapping more than 40,000 over a period of time, the chap was dismissed by the police! Despite the number of speeders involved I for one feel that the speed watch team were failing because the object of the exercise is to educate motorists and to have them keep to the speed limit, at least when travelling through a particular stretch of road, obviously the motorists were not learning a lesson.

Here in Rowde there has been a clear drop in speeding since we started the speed watch again, at least when we are out and about, originally we were getting a much higher percentage of speeders than we are now, so something is working.

I would like to thank all members of the speed watch team for their efforts and hope that like me they are looking forward to standing out in much warmer if not sunnier weather in the coming months.

Finally thanks also to those drivers in the village who keep to the speed limits at all times and not just when the speed watch team is out and about.

Tony Jeffries, Team Leader Rowde Speed Watch BUDO CLUB IN DANGER OF CLOSURE The History

Devizes Budo club was formed in 1957 by a few friends practicing Judo in their back garden in Victoria Road. They soon moved to Devizes and District Community Centre, an old Nissan hut put up by U.S. forces for the Red Cross during the war.

By 1958 the club were also teaching Kendo, Aikido and Karate and in 1959 they moved once again to The Old Crown on New Park Street. The first ever UK course for Aikido was taught

The first ever UK course for Alkido was taught at the club and in 1963 the first children's Judo class was started.

In 1964 the members of the club purchased an old ex army hut from Tilshead and had it erected on the land behind the Queens head pub. The land was made available by Maj J Bartholomew and Wadworth & Co Ltd. This became the first purpose built dojo in the West of England.

Unfortunately in 1975 the building was completely destroyed by a fire and the training had to be moved to Downlands School and Rowde Village Hall until the new club was built in 1976. This is the Dojo we still train in today.

Over the next decade many changes occurred, Kendo was never re-established due to the high cost of replacing the armour required for practice. The Karate section changed styles and Aikido moved to alternative premises for a short time.

Karate left the club in 1990 and no real training was done in this discipline until 2013 when the new Budo Club karate section was established.

Aikido and Judo continued to go from strength to strength. The judo club produced player after player to such a high standard that they were selected to represent Great Britain. Their successes include Olympian Julian Davies and Commonwealth Games 2014 Silver medallist Tom Reed. The list of other successful GB team players and medallists are too numerous to mention.

Devizes Budo Club is by far the most successful local sports club and have in excess of 200 members, mostly children. It is a registered charity and all the coaches give their time happily and free of charge.

We are now in danger of losing this wonderful facility as the land the club stands on has been sold for redevelopment and the building will be demolished. The club will have to find alternative accommodation.

Planning permission was granted for a new club to be built on the Windsor Drive allotment site back in November 2014 but the cost of doing so is approximately £300,000.

Many events are planned to help raise the funds, including a 24 hour endurance event, walking the Sarsen Trail and a Summer Ball.

We need the help of the local community to help us get to our goal. We are asking local businesses to donate prizes for our Summer Ball raffle and auction.

Any other help that anyone can offer would be greatly appreciated.

RED NOSE DAY FUN AT ROWDE PRE-SCHOOL

Children in Rowde have been busy raising money for Red Nose Day. Staff and children at Sunny Days Pre-school, based within Rowde Academy, dressed in red and baked cakes to sell to parents and carers.

The pre-school hoped to raise at least £50 for the annual charity event, which raises millions of pounds nationally.

1950s BUS VISITS CAEN HILL LOCKS AT ROWDE

Devizes was put on the tourism map last month (March) as influential coach operators from all over the country pledged to make the town a stopping point. Tony Aldridge from the Devizes Area Tourism Partnership said: "It was very positive. The operators were amazed at what Devizes has to offer and they didn't want to leave."



The partnership

organised a number of events to co-incide with English Tourism Week starting with the visit by 25 senior coach and bus operators from the Confederation of Passenger Transport.

They arrived in a vintage bus at Wadworths at lunchtime on Saturday 14th March where they were greeted by Mayor Sarah Bridewell and

Simon Jacobs chairman of the Devizes Area Board and members of the tourism partnership.

The choice of bus turned out to be fitting as back in the 50s and 60s it had been on the number 50 route between Devizes and Bath.

One of the highlights of the day for many of the visitors was the chance to sample Devizes cheesecake made by Giovanni Campanella at his cafe Dolcipani (read more about them in this months 'Eating Out' article on page 11)

Mr Aldridge said: "The first cake was so popular I had to go back to Giovanni and ask him to make a second one. It was little touches like this that really made the day special."

The visitors had a tour of the brewery, the canal museum and a canal boat trip on the Kenavon Venture. They later re-boarded the bus to see the Green and the Caen Hill flight of locks at Rowde before having dinner at The Castle Hotel.

The chairman of the coach organisation Bill Hiron said: "Devizes has organised a brilliant day and has set a standard of hospitality that will be hard to beat."

FOOTBALL

Sunday 8th March 2015

A 1-1 draw for Bath Road at home to Rowdey Cow Rowde FC saw Tim Knight's side stretch their unbeaten run to seven matches. Matthew Lever's first-half strike for the Rowdey Cow was cancelled out by Lee Grant whose seventh goal of the season earned Bath Road their share of the spoils.

After a goalless first half the deadlock was broke by Dean Taccuso who put the Rowdey Cow in front. Robbie Whyte added a second for the villagers before Lewis Taylor halved the deficit for the Foresters, but his goal was little more than a consolation as Rory Collins netted to earn Rowdey Cow their 3-1 success.



What is it?

The National Plant Monitoring Scheme (NPMS) is organised and funded by BSBI, CEH, JNCC and Plantlife. The aim is to collect data to provide an annual indication of changes in plant abundance and diversity.



Why is it needed?

Thanks to volunteers, we have a very good understanding of changes in the populations of birds, butterflies and bats. Plants are the foundations of ecosystems, but currently we do not have a good measure of changes in plant populations.



How will it work?

This is a scientific survey, so you will be randomly allocated a convenient 1km square to visit. The visit involves recording plant 'indicator species' in plots. Within your 1km square you will record around 5 plots.



Who can take part?

Anyone interested in nature who can identify plants, or who is keen to learn. Different levels of participation ensure that all who are keen can participate: you do not have to be an experienced botanist. There will be training materials provided and the opportunity to attend workshops throughout the year.



The scheme is the first of its kind and asks for volunteers across the United Kingdom to visit a kilometre square local to them and record the plants they find there in several different plots. The scheme will enable us to explore how plants in different habitats are responding to changes in the environment. It may be that there are people within your parish / community who would like to be involved in this government backed scheme which is being delivered by a partnership comprising Botanical Society of Britain and

Ireland; Centre for Ecology; Joint Nature

Conservation Committee and Plantlife.

- All volunteers registering for a square on www.npms.org.uk will receive a survey pack (survey guidance; species list; species guidebook)
- All volunteers will be able to access telephone and email support provided by the volunteer coordinator

- Volunteers are asked to record up to 30 plant species in any one square or linear plot as long as it fits into 1 of the 28 NPMS habitats
- Volunteers carry out the survey of their plots 2 times per year
- Volunteers may be individuals or small groups




