We were first established in the small market town of Malmesbury back in 1986 and moved to our current location in the historic village of Sutton Benger in 2002. The building dates back to 1726 and was built by the grandfather of Joseph Fry, the founder of 'Fry's Chocolate'.

The main focus of our food is classic French cuisine with Spanish & Italian influences throughout the menu. Our menu includes fresh fish, sirloin & fillet steaks and a traditional Sunday lunch. We have a list of over sixty wines, whether you fancy a glass of red, white or rosé, we have something to suit every taste and dish!

Ann and I had been meaning to try this French restaurant for some time and we are so glad that we finally got round to going. To see the building was worth the visit alone but the food was simply excellent. We had a glass of prosecco on arrival then two three-course, beautifully cooked, meals accompanied by a very good bottle of wine and it all came to just £85! We would very much recommend you try it and can't wait to go back there ourselves!

THE HURNS OF ROWDE (from a letter by Den Brock)

Hello Alan

As an old resident of Rowde during a very happy 5 years spent during the war staying with cousins Clem and Ethel Flower in what was then called 'The Gables', the 17th century thatched cottage just up the road and opposite the 'Cross Keys'. I saw in your JAN/FEB magazine the photos of pupils from Rowde school in the 1920s, one of whom I recognised. I am descended from a large family of 'Hurns' who lived in the village in the 1800s. I'm attaching part of a family tree which you might find interesting. I am descended from Elizabeth Agnes Hurn who left the village when she was in her teens or twenties to go to London in service where she met and then married Augustus Edward Brock and where she died in 1937. If this family tree gets to you alright you see that Win Hurn, in your photo, is the younger sister (by 10 years) of Ethel who I was staying with. The Hurns were all born and raised in the first cottage just to the right of The Gables. How they were able to raise some ten or more children in such a small cottage, which back then had no inside loo or bath, I don't know! Judging from the number of them they must have had quite an influence on village life.

I have a number of photos taken during the war, some of which were taken during days out 'picnicking' on 'the hills'. In those days there was a lovely wood covering the whole of the hill to the righthand side of Roundway Hill and we would spend the day in one of the clearings at the top, Clem fixing up a huge rope swing which would give endless enjoyment. It was somewhat spoilt when half way through the war the top of that part of the hill was ploughed up. I shall never forget those days and hearing the skylarks singing of an evening. I must be getting old!

Anyway Alan, that's enough of me reminiscing, hope you find the piece of the Family Tree interesting.



NEWS FROM ROWDE PRIMARY ACADEMY

Our bright start leads to their bright future

We have been extremely busy in Year 1 investigating the life of Neil Armstrong. Our topic is 'to infinity and beyond' so we have been exploring the wonders of space as well. We have created our own solar system in the classroom as well as making rockets from junk modelling. We have also created space pictures using chalk and made papier-mâché moons!



We have used role play and played out what it would feel like to travel into space and are writing diary entries, whilst pretending to be Neil Armstrong. We have also written fact files about Neil Armstrong and compared his explorations with Christopher Columbus and looked at the similarities and differences of their missions.



We have continued to promote our love of sharing books and in particular we loved reading the book *Beegu*. Your Parish Council

Parish Council meeting - Update

The information below is current at the time of the Parish Council meeting. If events or information have changed since the meeting, it will not be reflected here. The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meetings on 13th February & 13th March 2019 were:

Wiltshire News – in Rowde

Council House Build Programme Phase II – outline proposal to build on land off Reed Place, Rowde.

- Every household in the parish will receive a 'Housing Needs Survey' through their door. This will inform Wiltshire Council of any housing need there may be in the village, with regards to building new homes. Everyone is encouraged to complete the survey and return it in the enclosed stamped addressed envelope to Wiltshire Council.

- If you have not received a 'Housing Needs Survey' form, please contact the Clerk tel: 01380 501731, or by email: rowdeparishcouncil@gmail.com as soon as possible. The survey is open until 15th April 2019.

Community Led Housing

There was a presentation on Community Led Housing at the Parish Council meeting in February. Community First, Wiltshire Community Land Trust and Wiltshire Council have entered into a partnership project to deliver Community Led Housing advice and information to the communities of Wiltshire.

What is Community Led Housing?

Community Led Housing is about local people taking a leading and lasting role in solving housing problems in their community. Such proposals must have meaningful community involvement; where the community group owns, manages or stewards the homes in a manner of their choosing; and the benefits to the community are clearly defined and legally protected in perpetuity. They can be delivered directly by the community or through partnership working. The key is that the community is empowered to address their housing needs.

A number of community groups have formed already, including a group in Seend and Bromham. Community Led Housing are assisting them with addressing their housing needs.

Volunteers would be needed to form a group. The benefits of creating a group would be to make a difference to your community, get to know your neighbours, more knowledge of your local community, and it could be fun!

- If you need housing, the importance of being on the housing register was highlighted by the Community Led Housing team. There is one housing register and that is homes4 Wiltshire. There is also an open market register which provides intermediate housing solutions: discount market sale, shared ownership.

Statutory Consultation on Special Schools Rowdeford School

A legal case has been made against Wiltshire Council stating that the Council has not followed due process during its consultation on the future of special needs schools in the county. The outcome of the case will be decided soon.

Wiltshire wide news

- Wiltshire Council has approved its budget and set a 2.99% increase in Council tax.
- There is a motion by Wiltshire Council to acknowledge a climate emergency and to seek carbon neutrality by 2030.
- Wiltshire Council is unanimously committed to welcoming up to 100 refugee children over the next 10 years, as part of the national 'Safe Passage Our Turn' campaign to call on central government to fund foster places. There is some concern about the shortage of existing foster carers in Wiltshire. A plea was made for anyone who can give a child a loving home, to come forward.

Back in Time – BBC television programme is looking for a rural family to take part in their television series. They are looking for a family to immerse themselves in the past world of rural village life. They are filming the series in the region over the school summer holidays 2019 and are looking for a new family to take part and go back in time: those with memories of, or connections to, the countryside and village life. For more information and to apply please visit: walltowall.co.uk. Families must be UK residents and have a minimum of three children, ideally aged 8+.

Rowde News

Highways

Caen Hill Road Improvement Scheme

- There is an outline proposal to introduce traffic signal controls at both C244 Devizes Road and B3101 Marsh Lane junctions on Caen Hill. The design is being developed. It is estimated that a plan will be available for consultation in the summer.

Parking problems

- Problems are being caused for residents by school traffic parking in Springfield Road, Silverlands Road, Ferris Close and Reed Place. There are safety concerns for children navigating parked cars around the village. All drivers are reminded to park safely and respectfully of residents.

Dropped kerbs

- The Parish Council, in conjunction with HfT, has prioritised the dropped kerbs that it considers to be most essential at this time. The Clerk will apply to CATG for permission and funding towards the dropped kerbs needed. Thank you to Pete & Wendy Williams for supplying details of the original pavement survey (2010).

Rowde Village Walks booklet

Planning Applications

- 19/01258/FUL Application for Full Planning:- for ancillary equipment and food store shed, 2 x animal shelters, goat den and poultry house at: Land south of Rowde Lane, Rowde, Devizes, Wiltshire, SN10 1ST.
 - o The Parish Council objected to the application. The Parish Council thought that the application was incomplete because it does not mention access to the site, which would have to be across Rowde Common, which is under the stewardship of the Parish Council.
- 19/01115/FUL Bridge House, Caen Hill – single storey extension. The Parish Council had no objections to the plans.
- 19/01982/FUL Oakwood Stud, Marsh Lane: for the use of land and stables for a new equine business; extension to stables; erection of storage barn; stationing of mobile home (resubmission of 18/02904/FUL).
 - o The Parish Council was sympathetic to the business starting up and supported the application. They had concerns about the number of parking spaces due to the environmental impact and the size of the site; the lack of provision for drainage and trade waste.

Pavilion – demolition proposed

- A contractor has been chosen to manage the demolition of the pavilion.
- 19/02119/DEM: At the request of Rowde Parish Council, the chosen contractor has lodged an application to demolish the pavilion. The process will take six weeks to complete.

New Premises Licence

- The Scooter Rally has applied for a premises licence for the large playing field for their event in July.

Financial Matters

Village Infrastructure

Silverlands Play Area – adoption

Residents are concerned about the condition of the play area in Silverlands.

The Parish Council has registered its interest in taking over the management of the play area. As the area is in a poor condition, this should help to move the matter along more quickly. Cllr Cuthbert will request that the matter is expedited.

Repairs

- The faulty streetlight outside of 27 Tower has been repaired. Thank you to the local resident who facilitated this.
- The repairs on the small playing ground have been carried out free of charge.
- Wiltshire Council has stated that it has repaired the drain by 12 Devizes Road, however, the road still floods in this area whenever there is heavy rain. The whole section of road needs repairing as the tarmac has rippled opposite the school.
- The hedgerow overhanging the High Street at the entrance to the Church drive has been cut back.
- The Parish Steward has been asked to clear the path from St. Matthew's.

Church to Cock Road

- The Clerk has reported the 'Reed Place' sign as damaged. This will be referred to the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) for repair.
- The planter on Marsh Lane/Rowde Court Road junction will be replanted for Spring.



ROWDE VILLAGE SHOP

Hello Everyone,
With the current high street trends, it has not been easy. We are aware that everyone looks for the cheapest option and although our shop may not always be the cheapest, we are pretty competitive.



Bookers wholesale dealt us a blow by refusing to deal with smaller orders of £1,500 plus a week, excluding cigarettes and VAT. Something that is was impossible for us to do, so we have now found two smaller retailers willing to supply us, one being a cash basis and the other on a cash and carry basis. One is Warminster based and the other is in Sherbourne Dorset. We have also lost a small provider for our pies and pastries as they went bust. And we are currently looking for another. It does show how hard things are for a number of businesses. We have had to limit stock in some cases, especially with cigarettes and tobacco, as there is a limit on the margins we can add.

The other issue is staff. There are very few of us to run the premises. There was never the 70 or so volunteers mentioned when we first opened. If the shop closes for want of staff it will be a sad indictment for the village.

One thing is certain we cannot continue as we are. For three years and more we have been appealing for help, and as long as we struggle on, the village will expect us to be there for them.

We have 11 regular volunteers and with Kelly leaving in June that brings us down to 10, also with holidays, sickness and other commitments we can expect to have approximately 7 staff any one time for 60 hours of cover. It is NOT enough!

We have missed the Marina shop money, but still are very grateful for the Foxhanger boat orders in the holiday season. If anyone can think of generating more funds in any way, we will consider it.

We have experienced quite a lot of rudeness throughout the year. It is strange that customers will stand patiently in the supermarket queue, yet fly in our shop door demanding immediate attention from us even if there are two or three in front of them

Complaints have ranged from "your bread is expensive is there any half price?" To a customer

asking if she can pay £2.45 for a £2.50 item. When told no, the reply was 'it was worth a try.' Sometimes it does make us wonder why we stick our head above the parapet. Then along comes some lovely customer with home-made cake or biscuits for us. We do have a small band of regular customers who go the extra mile for us and it does make it all worthwhile. We really do value their kindness and help.

These are some percentages from the Plunkett Foundation regards current Community shop trends:

- Average directors are 7
- 30 volunteers involved
- 4 paid staff
- 59% have Post offices
- 43% have cafés
- 19% are located in community buildings
- 94% community shop success rate
- 46% business success rate.

We cannot provide a Café or Post Office, so our options are limited. Please read Janet's report and perhaps you can help by just buying those extra few items. We are solvent and working hard to remain so. The big question is; will we be so next year if our downward trend continues. It is up to the village to see we remain in business.

AND FROM THE AGM REPORT:

This is our eighth set of accounts – for four years we have traded at a loss and four years in profit.

The losses over 4 years amount to £18089 and the four years of profit amount to £8379. The net losses are, therefore, £9710 overall. This loss has obviously been subsidised by grants, donations, fundraising and sale of shares to the sum of £11487. The grants have also contributed to the cost of additional assets none of which could have been purchased new or replaced without them.

The turnover each year has reduced significantly (a drop of £16695 from 2017 to 2018), an overall drop from £149946 in 2011-12 to our turnover this year of £98243.

It is time for the village to decide whether they want the shop or not! It cannot survive on the occasional visit on a Sunday morning for a paper, a packet of fags and to pay the electricity bill. Sorry to be blunt.

We fully realise that people cannot do all their shopping in our shop, but we are not that far away from supermarket prices so if 50% of the residents bought three or four items a week from us it could make the difference between sink or swim.

For 100 residents to spend £3 a week with us instead of Sainsburys, Aldi, Lidl, Morrisons our turnover would increase by £15600 a year.

Jan Barber will be explaining the situation regarding the volunteers and paid staff which is also of grave concern. PLEASE nobody suggest saving money by reducing the hours of our paid staff, without them the shop would cease tomorrow – we have only ten volunteers and some can manage only an hour or two in a week.

Despite all the preceding gloom it is good to report that the finances are being very tightly controlled and we are functioning without an overdraft, our creditors are all being paid on a regular basis and there is less than £2500 left to pay on the COOP loan.

Message from the Rectory

Dear Friends,

Albert Einstein is widely credited with saying, "The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again, but expecting different results". However it can be very difficult to change our habits! I find that I usually get up at 6:45am, even if I have set my alarm for 6:15. And every now and then I make a resolution to really tidy my study, but the piles of paper soon build up again!

One of the reasons for Christians to change their habits during Lent is to build up our "change" muscles. Trying out new habits for the six weeks leading up to Easter can lead us into a deeper relationship with God. Traditionally, Christians have fasted, or given up rich food and drink, to remember the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. But Lent was never just about fasting – we also make deliberate efforts to pray together, to think about our relationship with God, and to be generous in our giving to charities and people in need.

We can all benefit from breaking some of our habits every now and then, and trying to form new, positive, ways of behaving. So how do we go about changing those deep seated habits that hold us back, and sometimes even spoil our relationships?

One way is to go out of our way to make small changes. Even walking a different way to work, or having something for breakfast, can signal to our brains that change is ok! Those of us who are more mature can take inspiration from teenagers who find it comes naturally to try out a new style of dressing, listen to different music or even get their news from a variety of places.

God might love us just as we are, but he calls us ever onwards, to change, and to become more loving, more like Jesus. Making small changes is one way in which we can practice, for the big changes in ourselves that God would like to see.



UPDATE FROM THE COMMUNITY POLICING TEAM REPORT

Advice for victims of fraud

If you suspect you've been a victim of fraud involving credit or debit cards, online banking or cheques, you should report it to your bank or card company.

They are responsible for undertaking further investigation and reporting criminal activity to us where appropriate.

Fraud that doesn't involve your bank or card company should be reported to the business or organisation concerned. Depending on their advice, you may then need to report this to us on 101.

Where an additional crime has been committed with the fraud, for example, you have had your wallet or purse stolen or the card used fraudulently was taken as a result of a burglary, then this should still be reported to us on 101.

Some steps you can take to protect yourself:

- Make sure you keep a record of all communications.
- Get a copy of your personal credit report from one of the credit reference agencies - Experian, Equifax and Call Credit. A paper version of your report is available from £2. If applications for credit have been made in your name you can ask to have any incorrect information removed.
- Consider contacting CIFAS - the UK's Fraud Prevention Service, to apply for protective registration. Once you have registered, CIFAS members will carry out extra checks whenever anyone applies for a financial service using your address.
- If you suspect mail theft, contact the Royal Mail Customer Enquiry Number on 08457 740740 or visit their website

If you are a victim of card fraud or online banking fraud you have protection through legislation, which states that you will not be liable for any losses unless you have acted fraudulently or without reasonable care.

Action Fraud can provide help and information online or by calling 0300 123 2040.



What to do - Disputes with neighbours Landlord and tenant disputes

Landlord/ tenant relations are a very complex area of law and the following advice is only to be used as a guide. For more complete advice you should contact the Environmental Protection department of your local authority.

The proper procedure that a landlord must follow to legally evict a tenant is:

- A legal written notice
- A court order for possession and
- A bailiffs warrant (to be enforced by a County Court bailiff).

Until all these three steps have been taken, the tenant has a right to stay in the property.

Neighbour complaints and boundary disputes

Neighbour complaints can take many forms. Please contact us about the specific nature of the issue/complaint and we can advise further.

We do not have the power to deal with boundary disputes. This is a civil issue and you need to seek the advice of a solicitor to resolve any boundary issues you may have. It will be worthwhile contacting your bank or building society (or whoever holds your deeds) to check the boundaries.

House parties and illegal raves

If your neighbours are having a noisy house party, we have no powers of prosecution for noise offences. You need to contact the Environmental Health Department of your local authority.

If you believe that an illegal rave is taking place then contact us.

Some signs to look out for are:

- Groups of cars and young people gathering in unusual places such as industrial sites, small villages or remote rural areas
- Interest in certain remote, rural sites such as quarries, particularly by people that look out of place or you wouldn't expect to see
- Cars and vans delivering generators to rural locations.

100TH BIRTHDAY PARTY FOR FORMER ROWDE RESIDENT

OLD soldier Vic Reed, who received the Chevaliers de la Legion d'honneur for his part in the Normandy landings, has celebrated his 100th birthday with family and friends.



Mr Reed, who grew up in Bromham and spent much of his life living in Rowde, was joined at Market Lavington Care Home by a large group of friends from the Bromham & Rowde Monday Club.

His nephew John said: "It was a lovely afternoon. Vic seemed to really enjoy it. He had his card from the Queen and a nice cake. Vic is a bit frail now and hard of hearing, but he has always loved socialising and has a lot of friends. He was an active member of the Royal British Legion and Wiltshire Regiment organisations. A lot of people from the Monday Club came along. He and Doreen

had been members for many years.”

Widower Mr Reed lost his wife Doreen last April when she died aged 92 after 71 years of marriage. The couple, who married in 1947, once ran the New Inn at Westbrook. Mr Reed also worked on luxury liners as a steward.

An afternoon tea was held for Mr Reed on March 5 and he wore his medals for the special occasion.



Mr Reed joined the army with his close friend Ivor Gardner in 1937 having joined the local T.A. before the war. They disembarked on Gold Beach on June 6, 1944 as members of the mortar platoon of The Wiltshire Regiment. They were inseparable until Mr Reed received leg wounds at Else, near Nijmegen, and was repatriated. He nearly lost his legs, but finally made a full recovery.

The two men first became friends at Bromham Primary School and were together in The Bell at Bromham, which later became the Oliver Cromwell and is now an Indian restaurant, on the first Sunday evening following the outbreak of war in September, 1939. A sergeant arrived and told them to meet in Devizes the next morning to join the Wiltshire Regiment.

After the D Day landings they were engaged in many of the key battles to liberate France from the Germans. Both men attained the rank Sergeant. Mr Reed was wounded during a battle in the Dutch town of Nijmegen and had to return home.




