1.	Apologies & Acceptance of Apologies: All Councillors were present. Cllr Cuthbert sent her		
_	apologies.		
2.	Register of Members' Interests		
	J Hawkins registered an interest in agenda item 14: planters on the High Street, by Manor		
	Farm.		
_	B Bentley registered an interest in agenda item 8: Rowde Walks leaflets		
3.	Chairman's five minutes		
	The Chair has completed a fourth planter to be located on the High Street pavement by		
	Manor Farm. This will be placed there shortly.		
	The Chair reminded the Parish Council that the group works as a collective. If a vote is		
	agreed by the majority of Councillors, then the decision must be respected by all		
	Councillors regardless of their own voting preference.		
	The Parish Councillors who visited Reed Place were thanked for their time. It was noted		
	that Wiltshire Council did not receive valid applications from residents of Rowde.		
	Councillor Sarah Howard-Ames was thanked by the Chair for taking the role of Council		
	Co-ordinator for the Neighbourhood Plan.		
	Mr Paul Lucas observed the meeting as a prospective new Parish Councillor, with a		
	view to being co-opted at the Parish Council meeting in September.		
4.	4. Presentation from Mr Glen Upward, of Devitera (microbrewery business).		
	Mr Upward is proposing to start a microbrewery business in the New Bakery, High		
	Street, Rowde. Some prototype beers were displayed: a small scale craft beer. The		
	grain will come from Wiltshire farms. It will then be sent to Warminster to be floor		
	malted, then onto the brewery. Retail will be through local farm shops and specialist		
	stores.		
	It will be a small scale operation with up to two brews a week, which will produce 16		
	firkins. It is anticipated that there will be a hop like smell for around an hour after each		
	brew.		
	• It is anticipated that the hours of business will be from 7am – 6pm, Monday to Friday. It		
	was noted that bottling is time sensitive and must be completed promptly.		
	Concerns were raised about noise resulting from the process. There will be some noise		
	from loading on and off pallet trucks. Plastic casks will be used which should create less		
	noise.		
	A question was asked about traffic accessing the site. It is estimated that there will be		
	deliveries 3 – 5 times a week, using a Ford Transit sized van.		
	A question was asked about how much water usage the process would use.		
	A query was raised about health & safety and security of the site. The site must be		
	secure due to the duty paying produce that is being created. Mr Upward confirmed		
	that he is working with the Environmental Health department who are advising him on		
	how to lay out the brewery.		
	A question was asked about the planners' response to the proximity of residents to the		
	proposed business with regards to smell and noise. The planners have not objected on		

those grounds at this time. It was noted that the property was previously used for industry.

5. **Public Question time**

- The Parish Councillors who attended the Allotments Open Day on Sunday 9th July were thanked for attending. C Stevens was thanked for all of the hard work that he puts into the allotments. It was commented that the Best Kept Village judges were particularly impressed with the condition of the allotments.
- A resident commented that it is inappropriate to thank individuals by name in the Rowde Village News for work they have carried out around the village. It was believed that others who have carried out work and who have not been thanked, could be upset. This point was noted by the Chair.
- An audience member commented that it is not always possible to hear what is being said at the meeting. The Chair responded that the Parish Council will try to speak more loudly but he would not allow Councillors to use raised voices during meetings. The Chair noted that it is sometimes difficult to hear Council members due to general noise from the audience. It was highlighted that this is a Parish Council meeting that the public are invited to observe. It is not a public meeting.
- It was noted that the road markings on Marsh Lane, at the junction with the High Street, are faded and need to be repainted. The Clerk will report this through the 'My Wiltshire App'. Residents are encouraged to report the problem through the App too as it will help to raise its priority with Wiltshire Council.
- It was clarified that in the minutes from the Parish Council meeting on 14th June, that there was a suggestion to narrow Conscience Lane for a possible pavement, near the junction with Devizes Road, not at the junction.
- A question was asked about which Parish Councillor is now responsible for overseeing the Parish Council's financial matters. B Bentley has taken on this role.

6. Wiltshire Council update

- Wiltshire Council has released its 'Draft Wiltshire Housing Site Allocations Plan'. The
 consultation begins on Friday 14th July 2017 and will run for 10 weeks until Friday 22nd
 September 2017.
- The draft plan is a formal development plan document and it has been prepared in accordance with the Wiltshire Core Strategy. It will revise, where necessary, settlement boundaries in relation to the Principal settlements of Salisbury and Trowbridge, Market Towns, Local Service Centres and Large Villages; and allocate new sites for housing to ensure the delivery of homes across the plan period in order to maintain a five year land supply in each of Wiltshire's three Housing Market Areas over the period to 2026. Rowde is classed as a large village.

All Councillors voted in favour. Matters arising & actions taken from the meeting 14th June 2017 8. Archery sessions Dates have been booked for the trial archery sessions on the large playing field. Wednesday 2nd & Thursday 3rd August 2017, 10am - 12pm OR Wednesday 9th & Thursday 10th August 2017, 10am – 12pm. Priority will be given to children living in Rowde. They will be invited to take part in two free trial sessions. The sessions will take place on the Large Playing field, off Sands Lane. Bookings are to be made through Kevin Whitehorn (aimontheplain@gmail.com or 07590691715). It was agreed that the Clerk would promote the Archery sessions through the Parish Council Facebook page, through the village noticeboards and through the Rowde Village News. Grass cutting Wiltshire Council cut the grass verge by West End Farm on 22/6/17. The Clerk has obtained a quotation from the Bawden Group for cutting the grass verge by West End Farm and the pavement along Marsh Lane towards the Marsh Lane Clerk bridge. The quotation was for £375.00. It was agreed that the Clerk would contact one of the local farmer's contractors and ask for a price from him. The grass across Malthouse Farmland has been cut back, so the footpaths can be used again. Thank you to N Bawden & S Pearson for strimming all along the permissive Marsh Lane footpath on w/e 17th – 18th June. Litter picking & refuse collecting The lock on the Parish Council wheelie bin was stolen and used to lock the toddlers' play area. A new lock has been purchased for the bin. The litter collector will continue to monitor whether a monthly collection by Wiltshire Council is sufficient. It was confirmed that L Brown empties the bins on the small and large playing field, and also the bin on Marsh Lane, at the junction of Rowde Court Road. Clerk It was asked if attention can be given to the Springfield Road area when the litter collecting is carried out. **Highways** <u>Footpath – Conscience Lane</u>

The Clerk has spoken to Graeme Morrison, Engagement Officer for the Devizes Area

board, who will discuss the proposal with the Highways department.

Road sweeper

 The Parish Council has agreed to have a road sweeper come through the village on Thursday 20th July, after 9am.

• The Clerk has requested double yellow lines at the junction of Marsh Lane with the High Street, and the junction of Springfield Road with the High Street, as requested by the Parish Council.

The Hill

• It was proposed by I Whittaker-Axon and seconded by S Howard-Ames that the posts surrounding the Hill should be removed and the holes filled in. If cars start to park on this area, the decision will be reviewed. A majority of Councillors were in favour of the proposal.

• It was agreed to keep the grit bin in Silverlands Road, locked over the summer period. J Dalley will arrange for a padlock for the bin.

• It was agreed to order 500 new leaflets (cost £90). Proposed by I Whittaker-Axon, seconded by L Wills. All Councillors who voted were in favour.

Dogs

- There have been two incidents reported recently involving dogs. A sheep and a ram
 were attacked and seriously injured on Sunday 9th July 2017 at Manor Farm. The Police
 are investigating the incident.
- A further incident has occurred in St Matthew's churchyard where an adult was bitten by a dog.
- The Community Police Officer has reminded the Parish that dogs must be kept under control at all times and that your property should be secure to prevent dogs from escaping.
- Please also remember to pick-up after your dogs.
