

The Annual General Meeting of the Village Hall was held on February 3rd.

The Chairman Mr.B.Barrett presided over the meeting and in his report thanked all the Committee and Volunteers for their help with the fund raising events organised during the year. The money raised is used to carry out improvements and do the necessary maintenance work.

He thanked the Handy family for their tremendous efforts to rebuild the Christmas float after their barn fire to enable us to continue with our tradition of collecting around the village prior to the Bazaar and also Sue and Geoff Edwards who made and donated the five figures which were (before being vandalized) decorating the fence in front of the Village Christmas tree.

He continued by stating that the only source of regular income is by the Hiring fees from bookings which have been very encouraging both by groups and individuals at times seven days a week which puts a great deal of work onto the small and aging committee to keep the Hall clean, warm and affordable.

He also thanked those who trim, cut and keep the grass areas around the building in a first class condition at no cost to the Hall.

The Project for 2014 was to fit new doors to the Games room, Kitchen and the car park entrance. All these have been completed to comply with current regulations. The Projects for 2015 are to redecorate the Kitchen, Car Park entrance, stairway and the Toilet entrance hall with emulsion and gloss paint on the woodwork and to paint the side entrance door.

Mr. Barrett ended by saying that the Committee is two elected members short and requested anyone over 18 who was interested to put their names forward or if unable to be a committee member to be a volunteer to help with fund raising events.

Treasurer's Report: Mrs.M.Burbidge presented the audited Financial Statement and stated that all the fund raising events again made a good profit and the Hiring Fees and Bingo profit etc again covered the main out goings for Insurance, Gas, Electricity and Water etc.

Secretary's Report: Mrs.A.Stradling also reported on the various fund raising events and the weekly Bingo sessions still makes a small profit and thanked all those who did the 'calling' check the cards, sell the tickets and the refreshment ladies and the many who helped with the setting up and taking down of the tables and chairs.






It was a 'free read' last month so we made a list of several recommended 'good reads' as follows:


- 'The Goldfinch' by Donna Tartt a thick book but an easy read.

- 'Nineteen Minutes' another of Jodie's books.



Your Parish Council

The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meetings in February 2014 & January 2015 were:

Parish Councillor Vacancies

o The Parish Council has vacancies for two Parish Councillors. If you are interested in matters that affect your village and would like to be involved in making decisions that impact on your local area, please get involved. No previous experience is required – just an interest in the future of our village. Training will be provided. Please contact the Clerk for more details.

Grounds Maintenance Contracts – bids welcome!

o The grounds maintenance contracts for the village are due for renewal on 1st April 2015. The tender documents will be drawn up shortly and all interested parties are invited to bid. If any individual, contractor, or company is interested in bidding for the contracts, please contact the Clerk (Rebekah, tel: 01380 720988)

Village Safety

- o Play equipment: the damaged goalforce wall in the small playing field will be removed and repaired in early February.
- o The Canal & River Trust has confirmed that volunteers will start work on 2nd February to help restore lengths of the towpath. In addition to these remedial works, their contractors will start to resurface the area between Marsh Lane Bridge and Lock 27, Marsh Lane Lock. These works are due to be carried out from the start of April 2015.

Defibrillator

o Some villages site their defibrillator in disused phone boxes. However, BT has no plans to decommission the payphone in the village. BT runs a yearly rationalisation programmed and the village phone box is not included in this year's list. Other sites for the defibrillator are being investigated.

Village Salt

o Salt for use in the village (on pavements and side roads) will be requested in August for next winter. The Parish Council is working on a Weather Response Plan with Wiltshire Council in the meantime.

Bins

o Wiltshire Council will move the bin situated on 'The Hill' to a site on Springfield Road. A further bin has been purchased by the Parish Council and will be sited on Marsh Lane near the junction of Rowde Court Road. This is in response to continued problems with dog fouling along these roads.

Allotments

There are two allotment plots available for rent. If you are interested in having an allotment, please contact the Clerk (Rebekah, tel: 01380 720988)

Large Playing Field

- o A complaint has been made about the poor condition that the changing rooms have been left in after recent football matches. The matter has been discussed with the teams involved.
- o A quote for supplying power to the large playing field is being sought. An energy company has been approached and is in the process of accessing the site for viability.

Highways

- o Work to make pedestrian crossing safer on Caen Hill is due to take place in March/April 2015. The crossing work has been timed at the same time as some resurfacing as it will save a considerable amount of money in road closure costs.
- o Narrowing of road at West End Farm: the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) continues to monitor the situation with regard to road accidents at this spot. Please report any incidents in this area to Wiltshire Council or through the Parish Clerk (Rebekah, tel: 01380 720988).

Jubilee Wood

o A grant has been allocated for improvement works to be carried out to the water logged footpath through the Jubilee Wood.

Planning Applications

o 15/00747/FUL: West End Farm: Erection of 2 steel portal framed structures to replace fire damaged barns. The Parish Council had no objections.

Update on planning application

o 14/11247/OUT: Outline planning permission for erection of single pair of semi-detached dwellings on land at Springfield Road, Rowde. Wiltshire Council has approved this application with conditions. The scale, layout, external appearance and landscaping of the development is still to be approved, including a parking breakdown and provision for bin stores for existing and proposed residents.

Neighbourhood Planning

o A Neighbourhood Planning Forum was held on 3rd February 2015 in Devizes Town Hall. Devizes Town Council, Bishops Cannings Parish Council and Roundway Parish Council gave an update on their joint Neighbourhood Plan and offered advice on starting a neighbourhood plan. It is estimated that the cost of developing a plan is approximately £12,000 -£15,000. Rowde Parish Council has had an initial discussion about this at the Parish Council meeting. It was agreed to monitor the progress of other local plans in the area at this stage.

Devizes Area update

- o Certain areas of the canal towpath will be made available for adoption by groups such as The Guides.
- o A proposal has been lodged with Wiltshire Council for the new Devizes campus.
- o 'Beat the Streets' is a new health initiative that will launch in Devizes on 6th May 2015. Beat boxes will be placed around the town and incentives will be given to encourage children and adults to walk as many miles as possible.

o Monthly invoices for January totalling £1367.34 were approved (proposed by S Stapleton, seconded by C Stevens) and the cheques signed.

JAN'S RECIPE Hot Fudge Pudding Cake INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup all purpose flour
- ¾ Granulated Sugar
- 2 Tablesp. Cocoa
- 2Teasp. Baking Powder
- ¼ teasp salt
- ½ Cup Milk
- 2 Tablespoon Veg oil
- 1 Teasp. Vanilla essence
- 1 Cup Chopped nuts if desired
- 1 Cup of Brown Sugar
- ¼ Cup Cocoa
- ¾ Cup hottest Tap Water

METHOD:

Oven 350dgsF

- 1. Mix Flour, granulated sugar, 2 tablsp Cocoa, the Baking Powder and Salt into ungreased baking pan 9x9x2"
- 2. Mix in Milk, oil, plus Vanilla essence with a fork until smooth, Stir in nuts.
- 3. Spread in pan, sprinkle with brown sugar and ½ cup of Cocoa. Pour hot water over batter.
- 4. Bake for forty minutes. Let it stand for 15 minutes

Thoughts from The Rectory

The nature of our society makes it difficult for many of us to slow down, and for some, including me, our personalities mean that we are even more likely to rush from one thing to the next.

Prior to coming to Rowde and Bromham I was frequently having to develop and submit business proposals in very tight timescales; so much so that living life at a fast pace became my normal way of life.

However, Jesus taught that it is not good for us to live this way. Luke's Gospel describes how Jesus called on his friends, Mary and Martha. While Mary sat at Jesus' feet, listening to what he had to say, Martha busied herself with household preparations. Eventually her frustration got the better of her and she said to Jesus: "do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me."

I suspect that, had I been a bystander, I would have sympathised with Martha. However, although Jesus responds compassionately, he makes it clear that Mary had done the right thing. Although this account must not be used as an excuse for laziness or selfishness, it is nevertheless a timely reminder that constant rush is not good for us. As someone once said to me we wouldn't choose as an epitaph "I wish I had spent more time in the office".

Taking time to pause and rest is important, and for many it is when we do this that we become more aware of God's loving care for us all. During this season of Lent our Churches are preparing to celebrate Easter. All are welcome at our Lent reflection groups – you will find details elsewhere in this magazine.

TOP HOMEOPATHIC REMEDIES FOR COLDS AND FLU

Aconite - Early stages of colds, fevers, inflammations. Complaints come on suddenly. Possible causes: cold/dry wind; fright / shock. Characterised by extreme restlessness and fear. May specifically have an unfounded fear of death. Dry. hot skin. Symptoms worse in: evening / around midnight. Thirsty for cold drinks. May say everything tastes bitter, except water. Better for: fresh air. Worse for: touch.

Allium Cepa - Common, feverish cold with streaming eyes and nose. Profuse, watery nasal discharge which burns upper lip. Red, running eyes with bland discharge. Headache, worse in warm room. Worse: evening and stuffy rooms. Better: open air and cold room.

Arsenicum album - Catches cold easily: burning, watery nasal discharge alternating with dryness. Frequent sneezing without relief. Very chilly and shivery. Nostrils become sore and red and nose feels blocked alternating with watery discharge. Worse: change of temperature, cold, damp and after midnight. Better: heat and warm applications, hot drinks.

Eupatorium perfoliatum - Chill followed by heat and sweating. Intense aching of bones as if broken or bruised. Great thirst for cold drinks. Worse: movement, cold, open air. Better: Resting, warmth, sweating.

Ferrum Phos - Tired and weary, not feeling quite right. First signs of a cold or flu. Red inflamed eyes. Chill with shivering and fever with flushed face. Hot, burning, gritty eyes. Worse: quick movements, cold air. Better: rest, cold applications.

Gelsemium - No 1 remedy for flu. Dull, sluggish, with heavy looking eyes and dull headache usually at the back of the neck. Chills and shivering up and down the spine. Aching muscles in limbs and back. Burning throat. Colds and flu usually comes on gradually. Worse: cold, damp weather. Better: after urination.

Nux vomica - Colds and flu with extreme chilliness; just cannot get warm. Nose blocked at night but runs during the day, or lots of sneezing alternating with blocked nose, sides can alternate. Sore or raw throat and teeth may ache. Thirsty and Irritable. Worse: early morning, eating, cold air. Better: heat, lying down, sleep.


Pulsatilla - Chilliness even in a warm room, nasal catarrh, bland and thick. Dry mouth with no thirst. Painful headache with changing, shifting symptoms. Worse: in a warm room, after lying down. Better: in the open air.

Rhus toxicodendron - Very restless with aching in all muscles and stiffness. Just cannot get comfortable. Heat alternating with chills; pain in the head and eyes with red face. Worse: night, first movement. Better: warmth.

Rowde Village News March 2015



The weather does not seem to show any sign of warming up yet! At least we have found some time to catch up on repairs to some of the buildings and re-organising the farm workshop. As the machinery gets bigger we seem to have less and less space to service it, and to carry all the necessary spare parts to keep it running in the summer. We have re-built an old shed at the rear of the workshop to house some items and have taken the chance to clear out 20 years of hoarding. The next task is to start work on the conversion of the old cowshed into a better classroom. This involves replacing the leaky roof with an insulated version before we can do the internal improvements. Hopefully we will have most of this done by Open Farm Sunday on June 7th.

This week we are due to have the annual 'MOT' on the crop sprayer and fertiliser spreader to ensure that they are fit for purpose and that they are putting on the right amount of products. All agricultural sprayers will have to undergo this test from 26th November 2015. Previously, it only applied to the larger farms. The test for the fertiliser spreader involves laying out a series of trays across the spreading width (24m), driving across them and weighing the amount of fertiliser in each one to ensure that the spread pattern is correct.

The hens have at last managed to start laying a few more eggs! Daylight hours affect the laying pattern and with longer days they will produce more eggs through until August when they generally moult and have a rest. They have two new houses this winter which means they are

less crowded. Unfortunately the wet weather means their feet tend to get very muddy which they then transfer on to the eggs. So, the next boxes have to be cleaned very regularly.



Concreting a new track

We have been doing a bit more concreting around the yard, which will make access to the buildings easier, and save mud being carried inside. Last week we completed one strip which only just dried before 12 hours of continuous rain. We are still waiting for a break in the weather to complete the job! At least spring is only just around the corner and the temperatures should soon start to rise – for the time being though the log burner is still keeping us warm!



ROWDE BOY FUNDRAISING FOR TANZANIA

My name is Aaron Holloway I am 14 and live in the village, I am currently fundraising for an expedition to Tanzania in association with camps international which I will be going on in 2016, this will be a very challenging but exciting experience for me. The expedition involves being away for a month (very scary) and being involved with various community projects such as building traditional houses and community Centres for the local people, work on construction and refurbishment of classrooms and providing teaching assistance as well as playing sports with the children, providing water to the villages and various environmental projects. It will be very challenging but rewarding.



As part of my fundraising I have already done a sponsored walk, helped at a refreshment stand, have helped with a raffle held at school and both Wes Foderingham and Tyrell Belford of Swindon Town have also both donated signed gloves to my cause. For my latest fundraising efforts I am planning to run a Bonus Ball competition on the last Saturday of each month throughout 2015 where I will sell numbered squares 1-49 and the winner will be the square that matches the bonus ball drawn on that Saturdays lottery draw, as part of this fundraiser as my expedition is to help the local community in Tanzania I have also decided to help our community by donating some of the money raised to the village shop fund. The winners will be notified on the Monday following the draw and a notice also put on the shop notice board.

For me the expedition will be a life changing experience. I have never been away from home for more than a week before and always have had phone contact throughout my time away. When I go this time it will be for a month and there will be limited or no phone signal so I will have little or no contact with my friends and family back home, very scary! I will have to look after myself and even do my own washing (by hand), even scarier! The expedition will take me completely out of my comfort zone and I will have to overcome many challenges but I believe this will help with my personal development and independence and will allow me to gain experience of team work, time management and financial awareness both in Tanzania and whilst fundraising. I am hoping it

will help to boost my confidence in social situations as I have always found social interaction difficult; I hope to gain the skills and confidence to overcome issues that I have in this area which will benefit me not only now but in the future too. Most of all it will be a rewarding life changing experience which I believe will inspire me for the rest of my life. 

Dog Control Orders

Dog control orders are in place in Wiltshire. In 2012, Wiltshire Council introduced four Dog Control Orders under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act (2005). The Dog Control Orders in place:



- Require a person in charge of a dog to clean up after it has defecated on any area of land within Wiltshire which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled to have access with or without payment
- Make it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to allow it to enter a children's play area which is enclosed buy a fence, wall or similar structure.
- Require the person in charge of a dog to put it on a lead of no more than two metres in length when asked to do so by an authorised officer of Wiltshire Council
- Requires dog walkers on Box Recreation Ground to keep their dogs on a lead at all times.
- o Anyone failing to comply with the Dog Control Orders may be issued a fixed penalty fine of £75 and may lead to prosecution and a fine of up to £1000.

MARY AMELIA DALLEY

This very special lady was taken from us on December 24th 2014.

Mary was born on the 11th of April 1936 and was raised and brought up at Mile Elm, Calne, by her mum and dad Maggie and Charlie burgess along with four sisters



and three brothers. She met Bob Dalley at the Landsdown Arms in Calne. They were married at Devizes registry office on the 8th September 1956 and had their reception at Devizes Road, Rowde.

Mary had five children – Peter, Susan, David, John and Roger along with eight grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

Mary was never one to sit around and worked all through her life at the potato factory in Bromham, the Regent fish and chip shop on the green, the Black Horse and the Black Swan. Mary was a very caring lady who would stop at nothing to help others when needed. She was also a great supporter of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance and she organized several fund raising events when a local villager was helped by the helicopter.

She got a local artist to do a painting of the air ambulance and this was then auctioned and has ended up in the offices of the helicopter. Mary so much enjoyed village life in Rowde where all of her children attended Rowde School. She loved nothing more than popping down to the local shop and having a chat with Jean and Di.

Over 150 people attended Mary's funeral on the 13th of January which I think goes to show just how much she was liked.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your kind words and support since Mary's passing and also a very big thank you to our vicar John who was so helpful and to the church choir at her service.

After the service a collection in Mary Dalley's memory raised £376.00 which we

have donated half each to the Wiltshire Air Ambulance and St Matthew's Church Rowde.

- Wiltshire Air Ambulance is available up to 19 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- The Charity's new helicopter started operating on January 9th 2015 and is the first Bell 429 to operate as an air ambulance in the UK. It has a top speed of 156 knots (180 mph) making rapid response to any incident within the county achievable within minutes. The aircraft is fitted out with the most recent Aerolite equipment to meet the highest helicopter emergency medical service (HEMS) specification.
- From January 2015 it will cost £2.5 million a year to keep the air ambulance flying, that's £6,850 per day.
- Wiltshire Air Ambulance is a charity and relies entirely on public donations to keep flying.

ROWDE COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH UPDATE

The Police stopped us from checking speeds for a time as they were carrying out a risk assessment of all of the speed watch sites in the County. Now it is all systems go for us and so the speed watch team has been out again despite the freezing condition and ice cold fingers. There have been lots of vehicles driving through the village, never less than 400 per hour whilst we have been out counting and sometimes as many as 650.

One of our new volunteers has had a hand at using the camera and should be up to speed soon (excuse the pun) especially if he remembers to bring his glasses next time!

So have the motorists been behaving themselves? One or two have been seen driving at 17 miles per hour! Methinks they have been trying to make a point!

Whilst we have been recording and reporting speeders we don't always get it right. On one occasion a car was driving through the village

at the legal speed limit of 30 miles per hour when, right in front of us, a car pulled out to overtake it and drove off at excessive speed. Much to our annoyance the car in question had a very dirty rear- number plate and we could not record him. So we missed the worst offender who being so annoyed at having to keep to the speed limit chose to overtake right outside the school gates. Worse still, the driver of the offending car either didn't see us or knew that he had a dirty number plate and therefore tried his luck.

On a lighter note Chris (another volunteer) and myself were nearly arrested for photographing the military, at least that is what we were accused of. We clocked an unmarked car with two soldiers in it as they were driving within the speed limit, suddenly they turned around and came back to us and asked if we had been filming because there had been a spate of civilians filming military personnel and they were concerned that was what we were up to. Thankfully were able to prove that we were innocents and avoided any further trouble.

Caen Hill Marina, in Rowde, was named runnerup in the best UK inland marina category to the delight of managers Rob and Cara Hodgson-Reed and marina warden John Tidy.

Mrs Hodgson-Reed, 45, who was presented with the trophy at the London Boat Show, said she was particularly pleased as the award was voted for by the people who moor at the marina.

The 250-berth marina opened in October 2011 at Foxhangers at the bottom of the Caen Hill flight of locks.

Mrs Hodgson-Reed said: "It is a great achievement to win this award from TYHA, especially as we won an award last year as well.

Nearly 30 marinas are in the nominations. Our moorers appreciate all the functions we do in the marina for them, such as beer tasting events, beer festivals, information talks about the canal and many more."

The couple have managed the marina since it opened. Last year it was named best inland marina in the UK. They went into marina management after years of being dedicated boaters.

BIRD OF PREY TO SCARE OFF GULLS



An action plan to reduce gull numbers in Devizes and the surrounding areas was announced at Devizes Area Board last month. The board agreed to contribute £3,200 towards the £10,000-a-year project, which will use a bird of prey to scare the gulls along with replacing eggs with fake ones.

The bird of prey, which is being supplied by Harris Hawks and Falcons, would fly three hours daily for 10 days and then 26 more flights through the year to maintain a presence in the area. On four occasions there will also be an egg and nest removal program for roof areas during April, May and June, with access arranged by Wiltshire Council

FOOTBALL

Sunday 1st February 2015

FC North Wiltshire and Rowdey Cow Rowde shared six goals and the points in what was a thriller at Leafy Lane, where, despite taking the lead, Rowdey Cow had to come from behind to claim a 3-3 draw.

Bradley Whitbread gave Rowdey Cow the lead which was cancelled out by Scott Austin who out paced the visitors defence to bring the scores level.

Dan Deacon headed North Wilts back in front only for the unfortunate Dave Leask to put through his own goal and tie things up at 2-2.

A second from Deacon, this time a simple tap-in, gave North Wilts a 3-2 interval lead, but yet again the hosts were unable to hold on for victory as a second-half strike from Rory Collins earned Rowdey Cow a share of the spoils.

Sunday 15th February 2015

A 4-0 win for Rowdey Cow Rowde over The Mallard saw them extend their unbeaten home record to eight matches.

Bradley Whitbread's goal on three minutes set Rowde up nicely for the remainder of the game before Joe Merritt's cross come shot on 18 minutes doubled the advantage.
