



NEWS FROM ROWDEFORD SCHOOL

Term 5 - Respect

The value the school will focus on this term is Respect.

Residential Provision

The residential boarding provision at Rowdeford School is in its third year of a three year, Service Level Agreement, funded by Wiltshire Local Authority. Regrettably, the Local Authority have decided not to fund an extension to this agreement, which means the 3 year residential service level agreement will come to an end in the summer. This lack of funding will, disappointedly lead to the boarding provision shutting from the end of this academic year. As you can imagine the school is devastated by this decision.

The residential provision has been an integral part of Rowdeford School for many years providing students with the opportunity to develop important life skills and independence. Attending the residential provision has enabled very vulnerable young people to flourish academically and socially, grow in confidence and make excellent progress across the curriculum. The residential care team deserve a great deal of thanks for their dedication and commitment over the years, working in partnership with the whole school and for continuing to maintain and improve care standards at such a challenging time.

Chinese Lantern Biscuits were made by the students as part of Chinese New Year celebrations in school, they also had a special Chinese lunch.

Duke of EdinburghAward

Year 10 have been completing their volunteering section of the award in the school woodland. This has involved removing introduced species such as Snowberry and Sycamore and coppicing the willow beds.



Year 11 have been preparing for their expedition. Pupils have completed first aid training this term and have demonstrated some excellent new skills.

Your Parish Council

Parish Council meeting - Update

The information below is current at the time of the Parish Council meeting. If events or information have changed since the meeting, they can not be reflected here. Please note, this a representation of the meeting and not the minutes in full. The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meetings on 14th March 2018 were:

Double Yellow Lines Proposal

- There is a proposal for double yellow lines to be installed in two areas of Rowde, and for the existing double yellow lines on Cock Road to be extended.
- It is proposed that double yellow lines will be added to Springfield Road at the junction with the High Street.
- It is proposed that there will be double yellow lines on Marsh Lane at the junction with the High Street.
- The proposal for the double yellow lines on Cock Road adjacent to the village hall is currently under review and will be discussed further by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council will respond to Wiltshire Council's consultation. The Parish Council has requested that the proposed lines on Springfield Road & Cock Road are reduced in length. They have also requested a passing space on Marsh Lane, outside of Andrew's View & Rose Cottage.

Planning Matters

- Glen the owner of microbrewery, Devitera attended the Parish Council meeting to give an update on the progress of his business and his plans for the future. The business started in July 2017 and has been trading since September. There have been 11 brews of beer so far.
- The beer can currently only be sold from business to business. Owner, Mr Upward wishes to apply for a license to sell his beer directly to consumers. There is a suggestion of opening a part-time tap house (possibly once a month) to allow consumers to experience the beer and a part-time shop, to open possibly once a week, to sell the beer. This would work within the constraints of the original stipulated business hours. It will be an ancillary part of the business, not the core business.
- G Upward has written to the immediate neighbours and asked for any concerns they may have. Three have replied positively.
- The Councillors asked about road safety for pedestrians using the site and suggested a speed limit sign and/or lighting. The Parish Council support the licence application.

The following planning applications were considered by the Parish Council

• 17/08775/OUT: Revisions to the outline proposal to build on land at Malthouse Farm. The Parish Council submitted a response to Wiltshire Council in time for 3rd April deadline. The Parish Council had no further comments to make on the application.

• 18/02904/FUL: Oakwood Stud, Marsh Lane, Rowde, Devizes, and Wiltshire, SN10 2NW: Use of land and stables for new equine business; extension to stables; erection of storage barn; stationing of mobile home. The Parish Council commented that the proposed buildings would be viewable from the road, which contradicts the statement in the application. There was concern about the need for a mobile home to be sited at the stables. The Parish Council supported the application as it is a new rural business but requested that the hedgerow is thickened and asked for clarification on the need for a mobile home on site.

Highways

Please do not park on the junction of Marsh Lane with the High Street. It is dangerous for drivers to navigate the cars parked along Marsh Lane and people are often forced to reverse back into the A342.

- The Parish Council has raised concerned about problems with parking on Marsh Lane with the PCSO. The PCSO has prepared a leaflet to leave on cars that park on the junction to increase awareness of the problem.
- The blocked drains along the High Street/ Devizes Road can not be cleared at the moment by Wiltshire Council as they are not a priority. Priority is given to drains in areas where houses are in danger of being flooded.
- Wiltshire Council has jetted some of the culverts on Marsh Lane, with thanks to Neal Bawden for his perseverance. Wiltshire Council said that some of the ditches had not been dug deep enough to expose the pipes, so those areas could not be jetted. It is hoped that the ditches will be dug deep enough soon.
- There is still concern about flooding by Marsh Cottage, at the end of Marsh Lane, at the junction with Caen Hill. It is suggested that there is a broken pipe underneath the dual carriageway. The Clerk will contact the Highways department at Wiltshire Council to raise concerns about the issue.
- Please forward requests for highway repairs to the Clerk or report them through the 'My Wiltshire App'. The more people that request action through the App, the higher the priority given to the issue.

Planters

- The Parish Council has received an offer from a resident to construct, plant and maintain a further planter. The Parish Council gratefully accepted the offer.
- There have been further volunteers, kindly offering to look after the planter on Rowde Court Road/ Marsh Lane. It is hoped that this will be planted in time for viewing in the Best Kept Village Competition.
- The Clerk has submitted a request to the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) for permission to place a planter on the grassed area at the entrance to Springfield Road, off the High Street.
- There will be a review of the planter on the Hill with a possible view to adding an additional one.

The Village Clean-up

The Parish Council has entered Rowde into the 'Best Kept Village Competition' again this year. We feel that we have a well-kept village, great community spirit and a lot to offer residents.

 A road sweeper will be arranged to sweep the roads around the village in the week leading up to 14th May.

Grounds MaintenancePlayground equipment

- The Parish Council has written to the Health & Safety department of Wiltshire Council to express concern about the retained base unit of a piece of play equipment in Silverlands Play area.
- A new item of play equipment has been ordered for the toddlers' play area next to St.
 Matthew's Church. Minor repairs will be carried out to other items in the park.

Commercial waste collection

• Grist Environmental submitted the most competitive tender and will now be responsible for emptying the Parish Council wheelie bin.

Village Events Commemoration of the end of World War I

 Representatives from the Parish Council, St. Matthew's Church and Rowde Primary School will meet on Wednesday 25th April to discuss plans to commemorate the end of World War I.

Allotments

Update on fencing plans for the allotments

 Some quotations for new fencing have been received. It will not be possible to fence the entire site due to cost. It was suggested that hawthorn is planted in the hedgerow to provide some long term protection from deer.

The use of animal traps

• It was agreed to change the allotment tenancy agreement to include the following statement: 'The Parish Council does not allow the use of animal traps, rodenticides, or electric fencing'. This new clause will be circulated to all allotment holders.

Neighbourliness

- Please be aware of any hedgerow/bushes/ trees that may over hang your property and cause obstructions for pedestrians.
- There is no such thing as the 'dog poo fairy'. Please keep our streets and grassed areas clean for everyone to enjoy.
- Please be aware of your neighbours and other villagers who use the pavements in the village. Cars parked on pavements cause an obstruction and put pedestrians at risk. Cars that obstruct pavements will be reported to the Police.

Parish Council Vacancies

We have vacancies for three Parish Councillors.

If you are interested in shaping the future of the village and would like to become a Parish Councillor, you can be co-opted onto the Parish Council. You are invited to attend a Parish Council meeting in the first instance as an observer.

Changes to the Data Protection Law GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations)

The General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") will take effect in the UK from 25 May 2018. It will replace the existing law on data protection (the Data Protection Act 1998) and gives individuals more rights and protection regarding how their personal data is used. The Clerk has attended training on the requirements for the Parish Council to be compliant for GDPR.

Local Police Update

- Inspector Chris Martin started in his post as the new Inspector for Devizes, Marlborough and Pewsey on Monday the 19th March 2018.
- The boundaries of the Wiltshire East and Wiltshire South Community Policing Teams are being amended to improve the way local policing teams are managed.
- Theft from Work Vans continues to be problem. It is thought that the break-ins have been carried out using a lock-picking device which is capable of bypassing the lock system without causing any damage to the vehicle. There's no restriction on the sale of locksmith equipment in the UK, meaning such devices are available on the open marketplace.
- Protect yourself against theft from motor vehicles:
- Don't leave any valuables including laptops, sat navs, mobile phones, handbags, credit cards or vehicle documents in your car.
- Do not leave items of value in the boot if you are being observed.
- Don't leave coats/jackets on show in the vehicle as a thief will want to see if there is anything valuable in the pockets.
- Clean sat nav suction marks off your windscreen, as leaving them is an immediate advert to thieves that a sat nav is in the vehicle. Make sure no sat nav ancillaries are left visible in your vehicle.
- Remove your stereo if you can, mark it with the vehicle registration number if you can't.
- Leave your glove box open to show there is nothing in it.

• If you own a van, make sure you remove your tools overnight and display an appropriate sign in the rear window making this clear.



However, as a really small business we need to sell groceries to provide a cash back service. We do not have a cash drawer full of money to fall back on from large numbers of customers coming through the doors. Tobacco and Cigarettes make us very little profit.

RECIPE Bubble and Squeak Bake

INGREDIENTS:

- 2lb (1kg) potatoes, peeled, knob of butter, and a little milk
- Salt and pepper
- 1lb (450g) firm green cabbage, 1 medium onion, chopped

- 2 medium carrots grated
- 6oz (175) Cheddar cheese grated.

METHOD:

- 1. Cook the potatoes in boiled salted water until tender.
- 2. Drain then season and cream with butter and milk. Slice the cabbage.
- 3. Cook and drain well, reserving the water.
- 4. Chop the cabbage, Put carrot and onion into the cabbage water and cook for five minutes.
- 5. Drain and mix the cabbage and potato together.
- 6. Spread half the mixture in a buttered oven proof dish.
- 7. Add the onion and carrot then prinkle 4oz (125g) Cheddar cheese over the top.
- 8. Cover with the rest of the cabbage mixture then smooth the surface, score with a fork and mark into portions.
- 9. Sprinkle the remaining cheese on the top and bake for 40 minutes until golden.

This dish can be made with a number of different vegetables, including broccoli, spinach, celery and small turnips.

"A promise is a promise," say the children.


They'll give you one more chance to tell them of your own accord. If you don't, they'll have to resort to torture.

Dear Friends,

This week I found myself walking home after dark, and after some weeks of wet weather, the sky was clear. So clear that there was a wonderful view of the stars, spread out above me from one horizon to the other.

One of the simple pleasures, of which I never tire, is a good dark sky. We moved here from Hampshire, where the sodium glow produced by streetlights in Portsmouth and Southampton pollutes the night sky and hides many of the fainter stars and constellations. But here in Wiltshire there is much less artificial light spoiling the view.

Looking upwards gives me a sense of wonder at the beauty of the universe, as well as the scale of it all. The light from even the closest stars takes over four years to reach our eyes, so we are looking not just into the distance but also into the past. And the bigger atoms that make up our bodies, carbon, nitrogen and oxygen, were all made in dying stars, so we are rather literally made of stardust.

The writer of Psalm 8 was filled with wonder too. They wrote: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? You have made them a little lower than the angels."

Rather like being on top of a mountain, looking at the stars can put our existence into perspective. They can make our problems and worries seem small in comparison, and give us a sense of awe and wonder. And thinking about how immense and beautiful the universe is can remind us that God is even more immense and beautiful, as well as powerful.

This is a prayer attributed to St Columba:

Be, Lord Jesus,

a bright flame before me,

a guiding star above me,

a smooth path below me,

a kindly shepherd behind me:

today, tonight, and forever.

VISION WEST OF ENGLAND

A new organisation in the West of England is being launched in May to provide direct and consistent services to blind and partially sighted people across Bristol, Bath, South Gloucester, Swindon and Wiltshire.

Vision West of England will work closely with key partners including Visionary, other local sight loss charities, national organisations, statutory bodies and most importantly blind and partially sighted people on developing services that respond sensitively and positively to the needs of visually impaired people and those at risk of losing their sight.

The organisation is receiving support and advice from Thomas Pocklington Trust and Wiltshire Sight. There will be two hubs in Bristol and Wiltshire where direct services will be based.

Vision West of England will work with partners towards developing a single point of contact for blind and partially sighted people across this area within the South West region, ensuring that visually impaired people have a voice. It will also work closely with Visionary, the local sight loss membership organisation, to align with their ongoing initiative to develop and provide good practice guidance for the delivery of services across the whole of the UK.

Leanne Hubbard, currently CEO of Wiltshire Sight, will take up the post of Interim CEO of Vision West of England.



Speaking about the new organisation, Leanne said:

"Our goal is to provide support for visually impaired people and those at risk of losing their sight, that aims to give them increased choice, improved access to the right services and support that will have a positive impact on their quality of life and independence.

"We will also collaborate with our partners on strengthening our knowledge of the causes of sight loss and how the effects of eyesight problems can be alleviated."

Leanne added: "We will offer a range of services from our 2 dedicated Hubs for visually impaired people, their families and carers. Those services will include information, advice and support; peer and family support; resources and technology; social activities; advocacy and training.

"I'm very keen to speak to visually impaired people and people from partner organisations about the new organisation and how it will operate. Anyone who has any questions or feedback is welcome to contact me or the team either by email or phone."

An inquest into the death of the 55-year-old man, who was found at about 5.15pm on March 23, is yet to be opened.

A police spokesman said: "We were called following a report that a body had been found in a tent." (reported in the Gazette & Herald on 11 April)

SCHOOL BOARDING HOUSE TO CLOSE

Staff and governors of Rowdeford school have been left devastated by a Wiltshire Council decision to end funding for boarding.

It means that from the end of this term children will no longer be able to have residential places from Monday to Friday during term time and 11 jobs will be made redundant.

Headteacher Mike Loveridge said that the final decision on the funding was not taken by the council until March 26 and until that point he and the governors had hoped there would be a change of heart.

He said: "The residential provision has been an integral part of Rowdeford School for many years providing students with the opportunity to develop important life skills and independence. Attending the residential provision has enabled very vulnerable young people to flourish academically and socially, grow in confidence and make excellent progress across the curriculum."

But Laura Mayes the cabinet member for children, education and skills said that the school was told three years ago that its funding agreement would end in 2018 and she said the £250,000 used to pay for the boarding places for 16 children could be better spent on other services.

She said: "What parents want has changed. A number of years ago they were more keen for children to be in residential placements but now the vast majority want their children to live at home."

She said that families that needed respite care for their children would be given places at Cannons House in Devizes or they could receive money from a short break scheme

which provides £500 a year for children to go on trips or to pay for a carer to accompany a family holiday.

But Mr Loveridge said the boarding places would be badly missed. He said: "We believe that this Local Authority decision is at odds with the national and local recognition that the provision has received over the years, and does not take in to account the future needs of an ever-growing number of young people with special educational needs and disabilities. We are saddened that the decision to close our residential boarding provision is because of a lack of funding from central government and funding cuts from the local authority; this decision will undoubtedly put pressure on other services, which are already over stretched."

ROWDE GIRL RUNS EVERY DAY FOR A WEEK

Schoolgirl Tegan Hogg went the extra mile for Sport Relief when she ran two miles every day for a week and raised nearly £300.



Tegan, 11, who is a pupil at Rowde Primary Academy was joined by her dad Gareth and other members of Devizes Running Club for the last leg of her run which finished in Devizes Market Place. She managed to stick to her running schedule even when she woke up to deep snow on the first Sunday of her challenge.

Her dad Gareth said: "She did amazingly well."

DEFENCE OF TREES CUT DOWN AT CAEN HILL FLIGHT OF LOCKS

Canal bosses have defended their decision to cut down a large number of trees along the historic Caen Hill flight of locks.

Walkers and boaters have been surprised by amount of felling that has taken place in recent weeks and a number have contacted the Canal & River Trust to complain about the effect it would have on birds.

But the trust said the work was vital to protect this important section of the canal from damage.

A spokesman said: "The work includes felling overgrown trees from alongside the side ponds and beside the locks which were beginning to damage the locks and encroach on the ponds. The work will remove shady areas by increasing the amount of light reaching the reed beds - an important habitat for insects. Removal of trees will also open up views of the locks to the thousands of visitors that visit Caen Hill each year."

But one walker said: "I am extremely upset. I am particularly worried about the impact it will have on the Kingfishers. They need to be able to have somewhere to perch when they are fishing. The kingfishers are dependant on the pounds."





But the trust said it was responsible for actively managing the growth of woody vegetation next to the pounds so that wildlife would continue to thrive.

The spokesman said: "The lock flight is also home to a wide variety of wildlife species including dragonflies, harvest mice, water voles and occasionally otters. The reed beds which surround each of the side ponds are used as a source of shelter and food for the critically endangered water vole along with reed and sedge warblers who build their basket-like nests hanging between the standing reeds."

Mark Evans, waterway manager at the Canal & River Trust, said: "The works here at Caen Hill look quite drastic at the moment but they really are essential in safeguarding the historic canal and maintaining waterside habitats for wildlife. The overgrown trees are having an impact on the ancient waterway and there are signs that tree roots are damaging the brickwork within the lock, potentially causing lasting damage. The work we've been doing at Jubilee Woodland shows just how important trees are to us at the Canal & River Trust - not only do trees create important wildlife habitats, they also give us a great sense of wellbeing. They help us breathe easier by improving air quality, they bring communities together and encourage people to step outside to explore the great outdoors and rediscover our wonderful canals. We have worked hard with local groups such as Help for Heroes and the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust to encourage more nature and plant life to Caen Hill locks so now, when people visit this spring and summer, they should hopefully see an abundance of plant and wildlife along, and around, the waterways."

We also held a Junior Tractor Driving Course for 13 – 16 year olds, which was a great success and we are holding another one in August.

Our Archaeology evening was a great success with over 70 people attending. This is the third talk given by Jan Dando and Phil Andrews, there will be a further dig this summer.

We held an excellent Easter Fun Day in the school holidays which was a sell out and everyone enjoyed visiting the farm, and Kris's Tropical Discoveries Workshops was a big hit with everyone being able to handle a tarantula, snakes and other reptiles. We received many great reviews after the events and photos of the day can be seen on our Facebook page, Rowdefield Farm Training and Education.
