Vintage Roots Wine Tasting Evening Thursday 17th August 2017

We were invited by longstanding residents of Rowde to join them for Vintage Roots Wine Tasting Supper with the allure of fine organic wines set alongside delicious carefully chosen food to compliment.

The evening started promptly at 7pm with a glass of Prosecco and an informal welcome by Chippie and Lance Pigott of Vintage Roots Organic Wines. The 16 or so guests were seated in the restaurant in a sociable square of tables which added to the evening as it made conversation flow almost as much as the wine! As the evening progressed we found out that some of the party had come from as far afield as Tintinhull near Yeovil for the event!

Each wine was presented and described by Lance as we were being served the appropriate course, it was a brief insight into the vineyard, region and why it was chosen for the menu.

Two different but complementary white wines from Italy (DOCG Gavi, La Raia, 2016) and France (Macon Village 'Vielle Vignes', Domaine de la Verpaille, 2015) fittingly accompanied a delicious selection of seafood canapés, a smoked salmon soufflé, and a platter of fig, pancetta and goats cheese salad.

Teriyaki salmon with risotto and a succulent roast lamb with vegetables were the main courses accompanied by red wines from Germany and Chile. The German Red was a particular favourite in our group of friends, very tasty and a pleasant surprise: Dornfelder Gutswein Trocken, Theodorus 2013. The Chilean wine was the Pura Fe Carmenere, Antiyal 2012.

Dessert was a selection again and the chocolate roulade went particularly well with an unusual red dessert wine from Argentina; Marlbec Dulce, Domaine Bousquet - very lovely indeed!

A Cheese board was also circulated for those with a less sweet tooth or with room to spare! We certainly could not manage the cheese as we had been





served so much lovely food beforehand - so we sadly had to give the delicious selection of cheeses a miss.

The pub staff worked tirelessly and cheerfully serving the excellent and beautifully prepared and presented food and producing countless numbers of fresh glasses and jugs of water for us all throughout the night ...

Looking around the room watching the guests tucking into both food and wine it was without doubt a very successful evening and good value for money. We will certainly be back!

The Recipes for this month have an Autumn feel about them....

RECIPES

Ceilidh Bake

INGREDIENTS:

- 1lb/450gms potatoes, peeled, sliced and parboiled
- 4oz/125gms streaky bacon, cut into strips
- 1 medium onion sliced
- 4oz/125gm cheddar cheese, grated
- 3 eggs size 3
- ¼ pint milk/ 150ml
- 1teasp mixed herbs 5ml
- salt and pepper

METHOD:

Arrange the potato slices in a small casserole dish. Fry the bacon until it is crisp. Remove with a draining spoon and place on the potatoes. Reduce the heat and fry the onions in the bacon fat until transparent. Place on top of the bacon and potatoes. Scatter the cheese over the contents of the casserole. Beat the eggs, milk, and seasoning together and pour over the casserole. Bake for 40 minutes or until set. Oven temps 375f 190c Gas Mark 5

Star Bake

INGREDIENTS:

- 1lb potatoes, peeled and thinly sliced.
 450Gms
- 1 knob of butter
- 1lb leeks washed and thinly sliced.450gms
- 1tablsp mixed herbs
- 1tablsp mushroom ketchup
- 8oz tomatoes skinned and sliced 225gm
- 8oz red Leicester cheese grated or similar 175gms
- 1 egg
- milk
- salt and black pepper

METHOD:

Cook sliced potatoes in boiling water for 5 minutes. Drain. Melt butter in a pan, add leeks, mixed herbs and mushroom ketchup. Simmer gently for 5 to 7 minutes. Drain, reserving liquid. Line the bottom of an oval oven proof dish with a layer of potatoes followed by a layer of leeks, tomatoes and cheese. Repeat this process finishing with the cheese on top. Mix together egg with 5fl oz (150ml) of liquid made up from the juice from the leeks and milk. Season with salt and black pepper. Bake in a hot oven 400f 200c Gas mark 6 for 50 minutes until golden brown.

(all or most ingredients are available from the village shop so remember to get them there, Ed)

QUESTION TIME

Q&A about UK Care Services

This might interest you! Every month we publish a selection of frequently asked questions by carers and the general public relating to the UK care services and other relevant care issues. An established care provider, Able Community Care Norfolk, was set up in 1980 and now provides its services throughout the UK. One part of the service they provide is to give professional, informed answers to these questions which we are allowed to publish in our parish magazine. We hope you will find this useful.

Question 1 – In order to keep myself as safe and as independent possible in my own home, which is an annexe built on to my son's home I have been given and purchased several pieces of equipment and smaller domestic aids.. However, no one I have spoken to has heard of a bedside mat, that should I stumble or hurt myself when getting out of bed in the morning will alert my family.

Answer – The product you are thinking of is a Bed Sensor Mat which can alert another person up to 150 yards away depending on the particular one you buy. They are easily available on the internet and are from around £45 upwards.

Question 2 – My neighbour tells me that when she travels to our hospital for an appointment she gets help with her travel costs. We are both pensioners and on benefits so how would I know if I am also eligible?

Answer – The HTCS (Healthcare Travel Costs Scheme is in place if you are referred to a hospital or other NHS premises for specialised treatment or diagnostic tests by your doctor, dentist or other health professional you may be able to claim reasonable travel costs. There is an eligibility criteria which you can find by going to the following website:

Question 3 – I live in a rural part of the county and feel it cannot be long before I have to stop driving my adapted car. I am concerned as to how I will shop; get to the doctors, etc. I live alone, have mobility problems and have no close relatives. Are there car schemes that can help me?

Answer – Different councils offer varying facilities to people who are unable to use conventional transport.

For example, some councils offer a Ring and Ride minibus service which travel along flexible routes allowing passengers to be picked up away from the conventional bus stops. For people who are wheelchair dependent, there is a wheelchair lift whereby you can put your own wheelchair in for your own use at the other end of your journey.

It is possible that there is a voluntary car scheme in your area whereby volunteers allow you to pre-book their car to a destination and the charge is a specified mileage rate.

Other local schemes may be in place. Give your local council and local Age UK a call and check what they are offering or are aware of.

Question 4 - My elderly, disabled Mother is coming to stay with me for a holiday. At home she has various pieces of equipment to assist her and she is looked after by Carers coming in twice a day. When she is staying with me, I am happy to provide the care but would welcome some ideas about where I could obtain some of her aids as we will not be able to get all of them in the car.

Answer - The Red Cross, which has over 1000 outlets in the UK, will probably be able to help. You can borrow wheelchairs, backrests, bath seats, commodes, walking sticks and frames, crutches and other smaller items on a short term loan. In an emergency situation equipment can be provided within 24 hours but it is better to give them as much notice as is possible. The loan of the equipment is free but a donation would be welcome. For some items, a refundable deposit may be required. To contact your local British Red Cross look in your local Yellow Pages. Many Mobility shops now provide items which can be hired so if you have one in your local area give them a call.

Question 5 - My sisters and I are taking our Mother to Germany for a holiday this year. Mum is disabled and when we take her out in the UK we use her Blue Badge to park in disabled spaces, etc. Is there something similar, we can apply for to use in Germany on a temporary basis?

Answer - The Blue Badge Scheme entitles you to concessionary parking in towns and cities, allowing you to use disabled parking schemes across Europe. Therefore, just make sure you take it with you.

So far Harvest has been fraught with delays and following 4 inches of rain in July and 2.5 in August progress has been very slow. We finished the oilseed rape in early August which produced an average yield although the oil content was higher than normal. Most of it had to be dried and it is now in the shed waiting to be sold. The Wheat has been delayed by the rain and so it has lost all the quality needed for bread making and will be sold as feed. This has caused the price to drop and we have sold a considerable tonnage which is going to a feed mill at Radstock.

However the sun is now shining and we have been able to make some progress, Wheats are now finished and we are currently (Bank holiday Monday) into some spring oats which have flattened by the rain but the combine is managing to pick them up. The next job will be to start planting the next years Oil Seed crop. We will not be growing quite so much this year but we will probably have more Wheat.

TENANT OF NEW COUNCIL BUNGALOW IN ROWDE SAYS IT IS LIKE WINNING THE LOTTERY

The tenant of one of eight bungalows built to help elderly people stay close to the communities says taking on the new property felt like winning the lottery.

Wiltshire Council owns the properties in both Rowde and East Knoyle, near Warminster and will be run by the council.

A spokesman said: "The bungalows will help older residents remain within their local community, have a home that is energy efficient and cost effective to run, and have suitable accommodation to meet their needs as they become older."

David Clayton, who moved into one of the bungalows in Rowde, said: "I never thought we'd have such well-equipped and high specification bungalows in such a lovely area. Everything here suits exactly what I need at this stage of my life, and I'm delighted with it."



The homes, which are built to a high standard and able to be adapted, were officially opened by Wiltshire Council and residents on 18th July. The bungalows are modern, well designed, built to a high standard and able to be adapted.

Chuck Berry, cabinet member for housing, said: "Wiltshire Council is committed to providing new affordable homes and this is an excellent way to utilise unused council-owned land to provide a much needed housing solution in this county. I am particularly delighted we are providing affordable homes for our older residents in rural areas so they can continue to enjoy and be part of their own local communities.

The schemes are part of Wiltshire Council's £42.5million housing development programme, which will see more than 220 new affordable homes built in Wiltshire by 2020.

The council is working with local communities to create, own and run 226 affordable homes for families and elderly residents across the county. These schemes will mean there will be approximately 5,540 Wiltshire Council owned affordable homes for families and elderly residents across the county.

THE GREAT COMMUNITY MURAL

In May the Church Insurers Ecclesiastical set a Competition to create a piece of original artwork to celebrate the role that our Church plays in our local community. All submitted entries to be included in The Great Community Mural – 10 metres in length and 3 metres high to be unveiled in London and then to tour some UK cathedrals. There is a winner's prize of £10,000 with £2,500 for 4 runners-up. The closing date to be August 21st.

It was too late to pass the project to Rowde Academy, envisaging a childrens' tapestry or a collage of ceramic tiles. Michael Cornwell suggested a collage of all the images we have - the Junior Choir, the Village Fete, Philip Hale's baptism candlesticks, Junior Church, the needlework diamonds, Church Flowers, the bell ringers, carol singers, the 8 o'clock community, Remembrance Sunday, the village shop, the Mothers' Union, the scarecrow trail, fund raising in the Church, HFT. Ride and Stride, Brownies and Scouts, Rowde Academy. With my design skills and my daughter kt's graphic design and digital skills we thought we would give it a go.

Sarah Bowler, Jane Moss, Alan Watters and Michael Cornwell sent us their library of images for which we give many thanks. Sarah persevered to get those that were missing. Michael checked what we were doing, answered our queries, checked that nobody had been left out. Finally we got a photo of Maureen with the needlework diamonds!

Alex Fruern at Original Glory in town printed it on the A3 form (poor quality paper) and I posted it to Ecclesiastical on August 17th.

I received an acknowledgement from Kate Costello there on the 23rd. Alex printed a second copy (on good paper), this is in the Church for anyone to see.

SIXTH FORMERS DIG IN TO SCHOOL LANDSCAPING PROJECT

Sixth formers from Royal Wootton Bassett Academy recently started building a path, orchard and chicken coop at Rowdeford School as part of an annual outdoor project shared by the two schools.

The year 12 students moved 40 tonnes of top soil and set other projects in motion during their two-day visit to the special school in July.



Head of year 12 at Wootton Bassett, Sarah Vaughan said: "For the last six years Royal Wootton Bassett Academy students have spent two days in the last week of the summer term completing community work at Rowdeford School. In the past we have cleared areas ready for outdoor classrooms. scrubbed moss off bridges, built stiles for use by the Duke of Edinburgh Award students, woven a willow arch and generally helped to tidy up the outside areas. This year the students have moved 40 tonnes of top soil and prepared an area for seeding which will provide a turfed route to the outdoor classroom that is being created in the stable block. They also weeded and prepared a small orchard area for planting and started work on preparing the chicken coop for new residents. Our students really enjoy the work and giving back to the community where some of their fellow younger students spend

A NEW MICROBREWERY IN ROWDE: DEVITERA

With Roundway Hill in the background, the New Bakery is a perfect home for a small microbrewery. It also gives me a chance to explore Rowde a bit more (I'm already loving the shop!). I would also love to host a family friendly community event in the future....one step at a time Glen!



I've had lots of great things happen, setbacks, and just plain old simple good luck. I'm learning every single day, and more often than not out of my comfort zone (if I look lost you'll know why). That said I'm living life and happy.

People have also been really supportive, and what many don't realise is just how small things make a MASSIVE difference. In all walks of life people are helping me. I've had retailers mentoring me on the industry, brewers sharing their experience, and finally the people of Devizes and surrounding areas be extremely encouraging.
